Associate of Arts (AA) Degree in Education

Recommendation:

Approve a New Associate of Arts Degree in Education, effective fall 2026

Background and Rationale:

WCJC currently offers an Elementary Education Associate of Arts (AA) track listed under the General Studies Classification of Instructional Program (CIP) 24.0102. This request seeks approval to replace the existing program with a new AA degree in Education with CIP 13.1206 since the field of education falls on the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's high-demand occupations list. Teacher preparation programs identified under various Education CIPs (13.12xx) align with the Texas House Bill 8 funding model that relies on specific CIP codes. Education majors benefit from steady job prospects, competitive starting salaries relative to other liberal-arts fields, and the opportunity to transfer to a university to seek advanced degrees in education, curriculum design, or leadership.

In Texas, many community colleges use a similar CIP of 13.1202, 13.1206, or 13.1210 for academic degrees in Education that prepare students for teaching careers in early childhood, elementary, secondary, or multiple levels of education. The proposed degree plan allows flexibility for students to select EC-6 or 7-12 training. The degree plan offers coursework in child development, teaching methods, and field experiences that create a clear pathway to transfer into a bachelor's program leading to teacher certification. In contrast, a General Studies degree offers a broader base of knowledge but does not provide the specialized preparation or streamlined transfer opportunities required for entry into a professional educator program.

Additionally, current resources are sufficient. No new courses, faculty, or facility space will be needed to support the program.

Associate of Arts (CIP 13.1206)

This is a recommended academic map for students planning to transfer to a university to earn a bachelor's degree in education. WCJC's Education Instruction program introduces educational theory and teaching methods while meeting WCJC degree requirements and preparing students to transfer to any four-year Texas public university. This map is designed for students seeking teacher certification in EC-3, EC-6, or 4-8 Core Subjects. Students wishing to pursue 7-12 certification should choose electives within their subject-area-specific pathway aligned with their intended teaching field. A criminal background check is required for course participation, and an institutional GPA of 2.0 or higher is required for graduation. Students should confirm transferability of courses with their intended university and seek academic advising during their first semester. College Readiness Courses may be required if placement scores indicate a need.
