# WE Collaborate: Flashing Crosswalk Installation - Bethany Elementary School PTO

The Parent Teacher Organization at Bethany Elementary School (BSPTO) partnered with Washington County Land Use and Transportation, the District, and the Washington County Sheriff's Office to purchase and install a solar rapid flashing beacon (flashing crosswalk) at the entrance to the school on NW 174th Ave.

The PTO funded the \$35,000 project through school-wide fundraising efforts supported by parents, students and families. The signal will help drivers see pedestrians more clearly, as well as give a better visual reminder to slow down. There is an increase in walkers and bikers to the school which decreases traffic in the area.

Along with the new signal, the school has successfully implemented a walking school bus that gathers students on several routes on the last Thursday of each month, generally drawing more than 100 walkers in a large group.
