In the state of Idaho, chronic absenteeism is roughly 21% and continues to present a challenge for improved ADA numbers. In review, to address attendance issues we implemented several strategies this year:

- Appointed an 'attendance coordinator'
- Updated our student handbook to reflect increased emphasis on attendance
- Proactive calls to parents/guardians with two or more absences
- Home visits with three absences
- Conferences with parents/students who are chronically absent
- Weekly perfect attendance drawings and a larger monthly drawing during 'student of the month' assembly
- Initiate a drop when students surpass the allowable number of days and no other options are available

Next year, we will focus on the chronically absent students to quickly identify causes and work with students and parents to collaboratively resolve the obstacles that are preventing better attendance. While we did not reach our goal of 90% in the high school, we do believe that missing that mark by 2% points for our at-risk students is movement in the right direction.

#### **End-of-the-Year**

16 of our 17 Academy seniors will be graduating Thursday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> at 5:00 PM at the Wilder HS gym. The afternoon of our final day of school also on Thursday will be an end-of-year celebration with various options for our students. We end the year with a genuine sense of optimism for the team and culture we are building at COSSA.
