Faculty Council Report to the Temple College Board of Trustees January 27, 2025

I. News

- During the first Faculty Council meeting at the start of the year, we began by reflecting on things we, as an organization and individuals, carry into 2025 and the new semester, including gratitude for Erica Perrine's leadership as Faculty Council president from 2022 to 2024.
- At the end of last semester, Faculty Council participated in the Trail of Trees Holiday Tree
 Auction to raise funds for the Leopard Food Pantry. The tree was purchased and donated back
 to Faculty Council for future use.
- Normally at this time of year, the Faculty Council President would present the Texas
 Community College Teachers Association (TCCTA) Faculty Salary Report. However, as of
 January 20, the report has yet to be released. According to information shared through a
 TCCTA discussion board, the report should be published before the end of January.
- For the first time, Faculty Council will partner with the Center for Teaching and Learning to cosponsor a Faculty Book Club centered on Small Teaching, by James M. Lang, and facilitated by Dr. Reid Echols (English). Each session will be co-led by faculty volunteers from different disciplines across the college:
 - Small Teaching, Part 1, Knowledge— Ray Stockstad (English) and Erica Perrine (Nursing)
 - Small Teaching, Part 2, Understanding—Dr. Geoffrey Lewis (History), Martha Hartt (Math), Sandra Melendez (Engineering Technology)
 - Small Teaching, Part 3, Inspiration—Dr. Michelle McCullough (Psychology) and Chad Cryer (Biology)

II. Committee Updates

- Barnhart Award Selection Committee (Erica Perrine, Chair)
 - Brice E. Olivier (History) has been named the Claudia and WT Barnhart Outstanding Faculty Recipient for 2024-2025. (For more information about Brice, please see the November BOT Faculty Council Report.)
- <u>Elections Committee (Erica Perrine, Chair)</u>
 - In the next round of elections, Faculty Council will add elected representatives to serve on the E-Learning Committee, chaired by Brian St. Amour.
- Faculty Advancement Committee (Dr. Lisa Keil, Chair)
 - Faculty approved revisions to the Faculty Advancement Grant Application to align with practices and procedures established by the Purchasing Department.
 - Because cost of travel has risen since COVID, Faculty Council voted to raise the maximum amount an individual can request through the Faculty Advancement Grant from \$500 to \$750. Prior to the meeting, we reviewed applications from the previous

two years and found that \$500 did not come close to covering expenses for travel related to professional development. By raising the amount an individual can request, we expect to see even more faculty take advantage of the grant to pursue quality professional development opportunities.

• Faculty Development Leave Grant (Kerry Bekkedahl, Chair)

 Applications, which are due March 1, are currently being accepted for the Faculty Development Leave Grant.

• Faculty Orientation Group (Kimberley Clawson, Chair)

 The Faculty Orientation Group set-up a table during the All-College Day meeting to welcome new full-time and adjunct faculty with "swag bags" that included branded gifts and helpful information:



 The Faculty Orientation Group also sponsored and led two professional development sessions during Welcome Week for new faculty.

• Satellite and ISD Campuses Committee (Dr. Reid Echols, Chair)

 The Satellite and ISD Campuses Committee continues to meet to help facilitate communication among satellite and Independent School District campuses and make recommendations about teaching and working on these campuses.

• <u>Social Committee</u> (**Dr. Sandra Melendez**, FC Vice-President)

 At the end of the fall semester, the Social Committee put together a very successful and well-attended holiday party, with catering that included vegetarian and gluten-free options. Leftovers were donated to a local charity.

• Ways and Means Committee (Erica Perrine, Chair)

- At the midsemester meeting, the Ways and Means Committee will present revisions to the Faculty Council constitution that will include changes to the Executive Officer terms of service and election cycle for purposes of continuity.
