- Danika Hutson visited campus on January 28th to provide business office training for the Allen Campus team. We appreciate her taking the time to come on-site and deliver valuable instruction on the payment plan system as well as on student payment processes in general.
- The new CDL skills training and testing pad was approved by the state on February 3. All CDL and bus testing is now being conducted on the new pad.
- Perryton High School (PHS) held pre-enrollment meetings for incoming sophomores, juniors, and seniors on February 4th. Karen Metzger, Monica Hernandez, and Rene Schwark attended to help promote dual credit offerings available to students through FPC. As a part of pre-enrollment, PHS hosted Parent Night on February 5th to educate parents on student high school requirements and opportunities available to students.
- Cassi Laxton attended the PHS CTE Advisory Board Meeting and the CTE Fair for incoming freshmen for the 2026–2027 academic year.
