

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High School Driver Training April 6 - May 25, 2010

This spring RCC will be offering a High School Driver Training course at IVHS. The classroom sessions will be held Tuesdays and Thursdays, **April 6 - May 25, from 3:30 to 5:45 pm**. If needed, students will be able to take the activity bus home at 5:45 pm. An additional 12 hours of on the road driving instruction that does not coincide with the classroom schedule will be arranged between the instructor and students.

This RCC course (normally \$439) is available for a discounted tuition rate of \$229 for current high school or GED students under the age of 18 who have a learner's permit, but do not yet have a driver's license. Because this program is being brought to IVHS through the school's 21st Century Grant Program students who successfully complete the class will also receive a \$129 refund on their course tuition, making the total cost for the class only \$100.
