RE: SSP & TSSA Board Memo

Dear Weber School District Board Members and Superintendency,

As you are aware each year schools must submit an evaluation of their TSSA plans that includes what actions they took to achieve their goals and how their funds were spent over the course of the school year. For the 2025-2026 school year, Weber School District received an allocation of \$11,061,780.64 which was distributed to schools based on the Board approved funding model. This model allocated 25% of the allocation to the teacher salary schedule and 2.5% to teacher recognition within the curriculum department. Additionally, this model provided schools with a base amount and a per student allocation of \$222.54, which was 72.5% of the overall allocation. Schools were provided their allocations prior to the start of the school year and had until June 30, 2026 to expend the funds with an allowed 10% carryover to the next fiscal year. Any amount over the 10% required a plan of action to be submitted in writing to the Director of Assessment, School Improvement & Research and if no plan was submitted any funds beyond that 10% will be funneled towards high need schools to support their School Success Plans during the 2026-2027 school year.

All but two schools have submitted their full evaluations in accordance with 53G-7-1304(5) and are ready for your review as a school board. These items will be placed on the consent calendar for the August 5th, 2026 board meeting. Additionally, the 2026-2027 School Success Plans and TSSA budgets are ready for your review. Due to the length of these plans, I felt it prudent to not provide physical copies as that would amount to over 1,000 pages printed for each board member. As an alternative I have created a document that will provide Board Members links to view the plans for each school.

Lastly, there are three appendices attached to this memo. Appendix A is a breakdown of total funds allocated for the 2025-2026 school year (including previous carryover), and the total funds that will be carried over into the current fiscal year. Appendix B is a breakdown of funds allocated for the 2026-2027 school year.

Please take a moment to review any desired plans within the document. You may notice varied components of the plan and that is based on a school's designation for school improvement. A

variety of opportunities for group and individual coaching were provided and the majority of our administrators took advantage of those opportunities. There are a few plans that still need to be edited due to missing sections or due to a lack of clarity. There are a few plans that are still being developed and finalized. Upon completion of those plans, their links will be updated and presented to the Board prior to the September 2026 board meeting for approval.

Should you have any questions or concerns regarding the structure of the plans or aspects of a specific school's plan, please know you can reach out prior to the board meeting if you so desire. I sincerely appreciate all the effort put forth by our administrators and their school level teams and I appreciate your continued support with this initiative.
