Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors for the Belmond-Klemme Community School District met for a regular board meeting at the above date in the Jacobson Elementary School Library at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was called to order by Board President Rick McDaniel.

buy our old laptops. Finally, Superintendent Frazier commented in the CDC rules for returning to school next year.

Renewing the District's Revenue Purpose Statement of SAVE Funds Superintendent Frazier recommended the board move to have a public hearing in August meeting to renew our school district Revenue Purpose Statement by placing it on the ballot at our upcoming public election on November 2, 2021. Finalize Legislative Priorities of the School Board Superintendent Frazier recommended the Board move to affirm their legislative priorities

- Funding and support for mental health services in Iowa schools and across the state.
- Fund all schools on the same per-pupil amount.
- Defeat Vouchers
- Remove the arbitrary cap on Dropout/At-risk funds.
- Raise the maximum salary under IPERS from \$30,000 to \$50,000.

Inspired Leadership Professional Development for All Staff

Board approved the request from the Teacher Leadership Cadre and moved to contract with Inspired Leadership for a program designed to improve the adult culture of our school system. Moved by Schlichting; seconded by Barkema. Motion carried 6/0.

- Assigned Katie Haning as a para-educator in Jacobson Elementary working with special education with terms of employment at entry level in accordance with the master contract (beginning wage \$14.68 per hour) at 7.25 hours per day.
- Held Jazon Heinz his contract as elementary physical education teacher for the 2021-2022 school year.
