In the Classroom:



It's such an amazing sight to see our sweet kindergarteners come so far in just a matter of 174 days. With these last days of kindergarten, we will finish up the greater part of our end of year assessments. With TPRI done, we now are assessing DRA, our district spelling words, and our writing assessment, along with math assessments too. We have molded and squeezed just about all we can out of these sweet kindergarteners and now it's their time to shine. As a whole, we touched on Cinco de Mayo, made Mother's Day gifts, and learned about weight, measurement, and addition. We will finish life cycles, our insects unit, and continue to work on word families. In the final weeks of school we will prepare for kindergarten graduation and prepare our little ones for what's to come in first grade next year. It's a great feeling to have another successful year under our belts! Summer, here we come!



In reading/language arts, students will be reviewing all our reading strategies and phonics rules we have learned this year. We will also be learning about vocabulary, retelling, and inferring meaning in books. In writing, we will be writing expository pieces about animals in various habitats. We will continue guided reading groups, literacy workstations, and responding to literature. In math, we will be reviewing addition, subtraction, time and money, ordering numbers, and graphing. In science,

we will be learning about the parts of a butterfly, and then will begin our research project on different kinds of animals. In social studies, we will be learning about inventors, Mother's Day, and special summer customs and traditions such as vacations, camping, and patriotic holidays.



Second grade is gearing up for testing in May. In math, we are studying measurement and review in all concepts for our SRA. In reading, we are continuing daily 5 and guided reading. In social studies, we will discuss Cinco de Mayo and Memorial Day. In writing, we are focusing on personal narratives and doing a practice test per week. In science, we are continuing discussing nature and spending time outdoors observing nature, including keeping our outdoor classroom clean.



In math this month, third grade is starting a unit on measuring capacity. Third graders are also continuing to learn and memorize their multiplication facts, so they will be ready for fourth grade! In reading and language arts, students are enjoying a novel study: Charlotte's Web. Students are engaging in activities with Charlotte's Web. These activities are giving them an opportunity to apply what they have learned this year about realistic fiction. In two weeks the kids will watch the animated version and movie version of Charlotte's Web so they can make connections, comparing and contrasting two different versions of the same fiction story. Third graders are becoming very proficient in writing. In the last two months, they have written a persuasion and friendly letter. Presently, they are working on their own realistic fiction about life on a farm. In science, third graders are learning about the life cycle of animals and plants and the function of the environment and ecosystem in which certain animals live. Third graders are learning

about important events in our history in social studies. We continue to encourage, teach, and inspire each day!



What adventures fourth grade has had this year! We are pleased to announce that our students are excited about being fifth graders! Persuasive writing will be our last compositions of the year. We are also looking forward to some imaginative writings as well. We will be working on filling in math gaps to assist fifth grade with the changing TEKS next year. Students are excited to be studying inherited and learned traits. We will also be learning about habitats and adaptations. We will be integrating science and reading by incorporating a novel into this study. We would like to thank the school board for all their support this year.



The 5^{th} graders have completed all of the STAAR tests. We have 11 students retesting for math and 7 retesting for reading. Two of those students enrolled from out of state a week before the STAAR test, and two students were absent for the initial tests.

We are learning about "Media Impact" and will look at different information and purpose, point of view, and compare the messages. We still review skills taught throughout the year.
