Re: Athletic Director Report August, 2015

We are very excited about this upcoming school year. The 2014-2015 sports year was one to remember and the 2015-2016 school year has the potential to be even better!

We will hold a Fall Sports Parent night Tuesday August 11th to help distribute forms to parents in hopes to cut down on the paperwork that the fall coaches face each year. The baseline concussion test will be available for those athletes who chose to be tested. This is not a mandatory test. The testing will take place in the schools computer labs. The meeting will be for football, volleyball and cross-country parents and athletes. Thursday July 30th was the sports physicals at rehab authority and through that we will receive a kick back (\$\$\$) to our athletic department. Fall Sports-
