Dear Mr. Huber-Kantola and Board Members,

The enrollment at North Valley High School consists of 144 9th graders, 152 10th graders, 150 11th graders, and 138 seniors for a total of 584 students. We have set some goals for the year; increase our enrollment and we have met this goal. One of the major goals was to increase communication between our school and the parents/guardians of our students. We have achieved this by signing up more than 403 parents on Parent Assist.

The other major goal we have been working on is our attendance. We want our students to come to school. If they are present we can accomplish many of our foundation goals. The 3rd trimester numbers show we have increased our enrollment; March of 2010 our enrollment was 90.27% in **2011 we are at 92.28** an **increase of 2.01%**. April 2010 our enrollment was 89.40% currently, we are at **90.91% which is an increase of 1.51%**. Our cumulative numbers are 91.68% just under the magic number of 92%. We are working hard to get to 92% by the end of the year.

We have increased our technology in our school; we put in a new 30 seat computer lab equipped with a teaching station which is being used just about every period of every day. We also installed active boards in all of our math and science classrooms and have conducted workshops on how to use this new technology in curriculum of these two subjects. Greg Osterman, Rob Saunders, and Mike Durrant have been resources for our teachers when it comes to technology and specifically, our math curriculum and best practices as it relates to the active boards. As a result of these products we have really done well to meet the state requirement of testing 95% of our students in State Wide Testing. This would have been real difficult to meet AYP without the new computer lab.

Our Accreditation went extremely well with nothing but accolades and positives from the Accreditation team. We are very proud NV stood out to the evaluation team in every category.

As of May 4, 2011 our Oregon Assessments of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS) scores have exceeded our School Action Plan goals. Listed below are North Valley's % in 2010-11, our current numbers, and the state wide %.
