Committee Charge Examples

The CISD Long Range Facilities Planning Committee recommendation will:

- Do first what is best for students.
- Support the district mission, values, and curricula.
- Strive for equity of facilities, defined as not being the same, but rather as supporting common educational goals of the district, including safety and security.
- Support student learning through the integration of instructionally appropriate technology.

The CISD Long Range Facilities Planning Committee is charged by the Board of Trustees to:

- represent the priorities, expectations, and values of the entire community,
- consider the needs of all of the district's students,
- use facts and data to make informed decisions,
- recommend a program that meets the district's building capacity needs for as long as possible and extends the life of facilities where possible, and
- understand the district's finances to develop short and long term goals that are fiscally sound

The independent, citizen-led body will have the charge of evaluating Coppell ISD facilities to ensure the future plans will encompass a clear connection between construction and district-wide improvements in teaching and learning. The committee will pledge to use a growth mindset when making decisions that will inspire innovation and high expectations for all CISD students.

The Coppell ISD Long Range Facilities Planning Committee will evaluate the current needs of the district and how to improve learning spaces that combine individualization, collaboration, and excellence.
