- Duluth Head Start serves children and families experiencing homelessness in all program options.
 - -In 2010-2011 we served 149 children
 - -In 2011-2012 we served **141** children (**67** in FIT)
 - -To date in 2012-2013 we have served 69 children
- State grant funds a program option, Families in Transition, (FIT) for children and families who are referred from area shelters.
 (funded for 18 children/families for 2012-13)
- Head Start, with our comprehensive services, is in a unique position to
 work with families experiencing homelessness. Whether a child is in FIT or
 a preschool classroom, we work to keep the needs of the child in the
 forefront by engaging the family in a number of ways.
