One of our Strategic Plan goals was to help facilitate smoother transitions between grade levels and building changes, and we've been hard at work in this area this year. Here are some things that have been happening in this area:

- Community Helpers & Visits: The PreK has been taking mini-trips into the community and having community members come visit them at PreK to help introduce students to everyone. Mrs. List has been integral in coordinating these opportunities. Mr. Hopkins is pictured above speaking to students about PE (and no doubt, the All Kids Bike program!). Mr. Wort from the PreK also visited Kindergarten classrooms at the main building to help him write better IEP goals for transitioning PK to K students, and in early May the Kindergarten teachers will spend a day at PreK interacting with their students and starting those relationships and connections early.
- April 9, 2025—Kindergarten Transition Night: Parents and their almost-Kindergarten students come in to experience "the big school." Parents listened to presentations from the Mr. Francis, Mrs. Harrison, Mrs. Harris, all 3 Kindergarten teachers, Mrs. Henning, Mrs. Clark, and myself. The PTO also came to share some opportunities for involvement and to order school supplies for the fall. As a bonus, parents could also complete

their Kindergarten registration process with Mrs. List and Ms. Myers on this night, eliminating the need for them to be at Walk-In Registration over the summer.

- May 7th, 2025—Kindergarten Parent Academy: We added this night to help better prepare parents and children for their Kindergarten year and to build additional connections between parents and their children. This night will consist of a dinner for parents and their children and then 3 interactive sessions for parents while children play in another area. The session led by PreK teachers will include all kinds of practical things parents can do to help their children be more functionally independent (restrooming tips, dressing, etc.). Kindergarten teachers are leading another session that will feature several make and takes and manipulatives for building fine motor skills, literacy, and math skills in fun and creative ways. Finally, our current Kindergarten parents will sit on a Parent Panel session where incoming Kindergarten parents can ask questions. Participants in this session will receive dinner time cards to help spur dinner conversations between families. All those that attend will also be registered to win door prizes that encourage engaging and creative play. Feel free to join us if you're interested!
- August 10th, 2025—Kindergarten Play Date: This annual event is sponsored by the PTO. Our incoming
 Kindergarteners come to the ICGS Playground from 1-2pm and have a playdate and popsicles before we kick off
 school a few days later.

Mental Health and Depression Awareness for 5th Graders

Thanks so much to Mrs. Henning for arranging and the Hult Center for Healthy Living for presenting to our fifth grade students about Mental Health and Depression Awareness. The program's goals are to raise student awareness of good mental health, raise awareness of the signs of Depression (including the warning signs of suicide), and encourage help-seeking skills. Our students were engaged during the presentation and participated in meaningful conversation with the presenter. Mrs. Henning received positive feedback from students, parents, and staff about the high quality of the program. Suicide is the second leading cause of death for 10-14 year olds, and almost 1 in 5 teens aged 12-17 have had a major depressive episode this year. We hope that presentations like this one will help our students know they are not alone and there is help available if they or someone they might know needs it.
