Why are we here?

- Projected Enrollment in DISD High Schools for 2008-2009 is expected to exceed 5700 students.
 - Not enough for a fourth high school
 - Population shift within the district
- Under current attendance boundaries 2008-09 enrollment:
 - Denton High School projected 1651
 - Billy Ryan High School projected 1853
 - John Guyer High School projected 2351

Growth at Guyer High School

- Increased student enrollment in the Southern portions of DISD (Lantana, Corinth, etc.)
- Increased number of students has an impact on cafeteria, library, hallways, etc.
- Necessitated placement of 10 portable classrooms at the Guyer Campus for 2008-2009.
- Plan to accommodate future southern growth and provide student population relief as the district looks toward the construction of High School No. 4

Reasons for attendance boundary changes in 2009-2010...

- 1. Essential to provide relief to the student enrollment numbers at John Guyer High School
- 2. DISD has room for high school students at DHS and RHS
- 3. Movement towards the location of High School No. 4
- 4. Provide DISD families advance notice to high school attendance boundary changes
- 5. Move towards an alignment creating high school attendance lines encompassing two middle schools.

The following plan is a proposal to address all of these reasons.

Spring 2008 Proposed High School Boundaries 2009-10

- 1. New Area Assigned to Ryan HS
 Area east I35E inclusive from I35E &
 Loop 288 northeast to Spencer Road.
 East on Spencer to the City of Denton
 Recycling Complex. Southeast from the
 City of Denton Recycling Complex to
 Lewisville Lake. South following the
 Lewisville Lake shoreline to the southern
 boundary of DISD. West following the DISD
 boundary to I35E. North on I35E to Loop
 288.
- 2. New Area Assigned to Denton HS Area inclusive from I35E at Lillian Miller Parkway south on I35E to State School Road. South on State School Road to the northern boundary of Oak Mont II. West following the Oak Mont II northern property line to the easement separating Oak Mont II & Robinson Oaks. South on a line between Oakmont II & Robinson Oaks to Robinson Road, West on Robinson Road to Teasley. North on Teasley to Ryan Road. West on Ryan Road to the drainage easement west of the Denton West Community. North on a line following the drainage easement to Helm & Teasley. North on Teasley to Lillian Miller & I-35E.



Denton I.S.D. Transfer Policy

Request for student transfer will be governed by DISD's regular transfer policy. It is also the desire of the District not to forcibly split families between two high schools. Therefore, students with an older sibling remaining at the existing campuses <u>may be allowed</u> to transfer to that campus. <u>In these situations</u>, <u>parents will be responsible for transportation</u>.
