I write today as a Beecher parent to express full support for all concerns cited and reopening procedures suggested by Beecher faculty in their letter to you of August 14th. Every Beecher parent should receive a copy of their letter.

No member of our community is expendable, and we have no right to expect our teachers to assume unnecessary risk to themselves, our children & greater community by forcing Beecher to reopen with a plan aligned neither with the realities of the daily needs and behavior of children nor with CDC guidelines.

I am at this point angry on our teachers' behalf; why is it upon them to outline a safe and practical plan consistent with the CDC? Why must they write to you to defend their own and our children's safety and well-being, when that is the job and due diligence of our state and the Board?
