

Required state testing for grades 3-5 will be this spring. Specific dates will be in the newsletter when testing gets closer so that parents know the actual dates their children will test. State law requires parents be notified of their right to opt-out their child from state testing, even though NES, the Neah-Kah-Nie School District and the Oregon Department of Education recommends that all students test. Welcome February!

In January we learned about showing and responding with compassion. Having compassion requires us to have empathy for others by understanding how someone else is feeling. We continue to learn about recognizing our own feelings which is a necessary skill needed so we can show compassion and be empathetic towards others.



We also continued lessons in our Child Protection Unit. Students learned about safe, unsafe, and unwanted touches. They also learned to say no and refuse unsafe or unwanted touches. I encourage you to ask your kids what the difference is between an unsafe touch and an unwanted touch. An unsafe touch hurts our body: hitting, kicking, pushing, etc. An unwanted touch is a touch you don't want. An unwanted touch can be a safe touch: Hugs, pats on the back, arm and arm, etc. BUT it is a safe touch you don't want. Students have learned to tap into how they feel about a safe touch to know if it is unwanted or not. We continue to learn that their body belongs to them and it is ABSOLUTELY OKAY for them to say no to an unwanted touch. The first week of February, we will finish up our Child Protection unit with learning about The private body parts rule.

We will also celebrate Kindness in February. February 17th is Random Act of Kindness day. We will have students practice random acts of Kindness throughout the month with the intention of making Kindness part of our everyday life!

Mindfulness (another way to describe it to younger kids - being where your feet are) will continue to be incorporated into our SEL lessons this year. Practicing mindfulness is a great way to train our brains to regain focus and calm. and be "present" in the moment (without judgment), whether it be in the classroom, at lunch, at recess or at home with family. I encourage you to practice this with your students at home. The more they practice, the more automatic a mindfulness response becomes. MindYeti is a great resource for PreK - 3rd grade. It was created by the Committee for Children who is the creator of Second Step, the SEL curriculum used at NES. Waterford.orgis another great resource for kids and mindfulness as well.

The Nehalem Elementary School Backpack Program is an ongoing volunteer-based organization that provides food for local hungry children at times when other resources are not available, such as weekends and holidays. Volunteers provide the children who are enrolled in the program with a bag of food for the weekend. These food resources will support the health, behavior, and achievement of every student that participates. The success in programs like this can be seen in positive changes in student attendance, behaviors, and grades.

We pick up your students at Nehalem Elementary school at the end of each school day and are open until 5pm. The cost is \$6 per day per child. This does include a nutritious snack and a host of enrichment activities (outdoor play/walks, gym time, crafts, music, science, etc.) If interested, please reach out to Angie or Kiley at NCRD by phone, email, website, or just stop in. We offer full-day childcare on non-school days but are closed on all Federal holidays. No school days are \$20 per student with preregistration.
