
1<sup>st</sup> Grade Fall scores based on letter sounds, spring scores based on fluency passages (53 wpm).




Adequate growth for one year in Math is 19 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 53 students who met their Math goal (last year 23), and 47 who met their Reading goal (last year 23).




Pre-First takes the 1<sup>st</sup> grade MAP tests. Adequate growth for one year in Math is 18 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 6 students who met their Math goal (last year 7), and 7 met their Reading goal (last year 6).




Adequate growth for one year in Math is 18 RIT points. Adequate growth for one year in reading is 17 RIT points. There were 67 students who met their Math goal(last year 47), and 56 met their Reading goal (last year 49).



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 15 RIT points, Reading is 14 RIT points, Language is 15 RIT points. There were 49 students who met their Language goal (last year 48), 58 met their Math goal (last year 31), and 53 met their Reading goal (last year 44).



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 13 RIT points, Reading is 10 RIT points, Language is 11 RIT points. There were 51 students who met their Language goal (last year 56), 69 met their Math goal (last year 45), and 60 met their Reading goal (last year 47).



Adequate growth for one year: Math is 12 RIT points, Reading is 8 RIT points, Language is 8 RIT points. There were 57 students who met their Language goal (last year 52), 59 met their Math goal (last year 43), and 72 met their Reading goal (last year 35).

BIKES FOR BOOKS: Silver City Masonic Lodge #13 donated eight (8) bikes to be given away to students who read books between February 12<sup>th</sup> and May 17<sup>th</sup>. Each student had to read 10 books to be able to earn a ticket for the drawing. They could read as many books as they wanted to earn tickets. The 1st grade students read 3,260 books, up from last year's 1,300 books. The 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students read 3,790 books, up from 2,330 books last year. The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students read 3,070 books, up from last year's 3,010 books, and 4th grade read 2,690 books, up from last year's 2,390 books. This year the students read 12,810 books compared to last year's total of 9,030 books. The students read 3,780 more books this year!! Cora McKerrow broke the all-time individual record by reading 400 books! This year's winners were Mackenzie Bell & Fabian Pina-Martinez (1st grade), Amanda Alcantara & Adrian Vega (2nd grade), Lily Mitchell & Dominick Montes (3<sup>rd</sup> grade), Stella Heck & Ezzy Escalante (4<sup>th</sup> grade).
