Peacemaker Award

We are excited to announce the Beach Middle School “Peacemaker Award,” which is a collaborative effort between BMS and the Chelsea Rotary Club. Starting in the month of February, students and staff members will have the opportunity to nominate students who are positive forces in our building and in our community--students who stand up for others, disrupt unkind behavior, and work to create a positive, inclusive environment for all.

One student from each grade level will be honored at monthly community meetings and will earn a dove pin, as a symbol of the peace they work to spread around them. At the end of the year, one overall “Peacemaker” will be selected from 8th grade and from 6th/7th grade. The 8th grade winner will be announced at the annual 8th Grade Farewell celebration and will receive \$350, while the 6th/7th grade winner will receive a smaller monetary prize. This new tradition will recognize qualities of the Portrait of a Graduate as they relate to empathy, character, and integrity.
