
Track & Field sports registration is now open. Registration is through ParentVue. First day of practice for track and field is on Monday, March 2, 2026. Athletes need a sports

McKinney-Vento Program

Support for Families Experiencing Housing Instability

The McKinney-Vento Act ensures that children and youth experiencing houselessness are provided uninterrupted access to education and services despite the lack of a fixed, adequate, nighttime place of residence.

Housing instability may look like...

- ⇒ Doubled-up with others due to loss of housing or economic hardship
- ⇒ Living in a motel or shelter/transitional home
- ⇒ Living in a car, tent, etc.
- ⇒ Living in unsafe or inadequate conditions such as a house or building without electricity or plumbing.

Support may include...

- ⇒ Immediate school enrollment
- ⇒ Remaining in school of origin
- ⇒ Transportation to and from school of origin
- ⇒ School supplies and clothing
- ⇒ Participation in school activities and programs
- ⇒ Support from your school's Family Advocate

Programa de McKinney-Vento

Asistencia para las familias que estén pasando inestabilidad en la vivienda

La Ley McKinney-Vento garantiza que los niños y jóvenes sin hogar se les proporcione acceso ininterrumpido a la educación y a los servicios a pesar de la falta de una vivienda nocturna fija y adecuada.

La inestabilidad de la vivienda puede tener aspecto de...

- ⇒ Estar viviendo con otros debido a la perdida de vivienda o dificultades económicas
- ⇒ Estar viviendo en un motel o refugio/lugar transicional
- ⇒ Estar viviendo en un coche, tienda de campaña, etc.
- ⇒ Estar viviendo en lugares inseguros o en condiciones inadecuados como en una casa o edificio sin electricidad o sin fontanería

Los servicios de asistencia pueden incluir...

- ⇒ Inscripción escolar inmediata
- ⇒ Permanecer en la escuela de origen
- ⇒ Transporte hacia y desde la escuela de origen
- ⇒ Útiles escolares y ropa
- ⇒ Participación en actividades y programas escolares
- ⇒ Apoyo de parte del partidario familiar de su escuela
