## I. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

## A. Recognitions

- 1. National Principals' Month Supt. O'Neill recognized the essential role that Principals play and the leadership, dedication, and determination for achieving student success. Skip expressed his appreciation and stated he values what our principals do.
- 2. National School Safety Week October 21-27 We will be observing Safe Schools week at VCS. The Administration wants the community to know that we are committed to the safety and security of all students and staff.
- B. October 3, 2018 Count Figures Supt. O'Neill reported the preliminary numbers showed a count of 2,663 students. We are pleased with these figures which is an increase over last school year.
- C. Legislative/Election Update
  - School Equity Caucus Newsletter Supt. O'Neill stated that it is still very quiet in Lansing. There are three proposals on the ballot: Proposal 1. Regulate Marijuana Like Alcohol, Proposal 2. Voters Not Politicians, and Proposal 3. Promote The Vote.
  - 2. School Equity Caucus 2018-19 Targeted Goals The message needs to be clear that schools are not funded equitably. There needs to be more action to promote equity.

A. Life Long Learners and Life Long Leaders - Amie McCaw – Principal McCaw shared the 2017-18 Sunset Lake Annual Report. She introduced her PTSO members and expressed her appreciation for all they do. She introduced Officer Derek Guthrie who helped with the ALICE training. She thanked him for being at the school and interacting so positively with the students. Amie discussed The High Impact Leadership Grant which is centered on literacy. It is a three-year
