Please state your proposal briefly and clearly. What do you want the board to know, discuss, or decide?

The district is seeking a resolution by the Board, acting as the Local Contract Review Board, to allow exemptions to the bid requirements for the Fort Vannoy Flood Repair project. The resolution will designate Dave Valenzuela and/or Casey Alderson as staff members authorized to approve bids and purchases during the emergency phase.

Provide history/background information on your proposal.

Oregon Revised Statutes allow for exemptions after providing written findings supporting the use of non-competitive bid processes and showing compliance with applicable statutes. ORS 27B.050 provides that, with certain exceptions, contracting agencies such as the District shall award public contracts for goods and/or services by competitive sealed bidding or by competitive sealed proposals. One exception is provided in ORS 279B.080, stating that contracting agency may make, or authorize others to make, emergency procuements of good or services in an emergency. ORS 279A.010 (I)(f) defines "emergency" as circumstances that: (A) could not have been reasonably foreseen; (B) create a substantial risk of loss, damage or interruption of services or a substatial threat to property, public health, welfare or safety; and (C) require prompt execution of a contract to remedy the condition.
