

## **MCS D Safety Procedures Report:**

MCS D takes student and staff safety seriously; We have many preventative measures in place in our schools that provide for the safety of our students and staff.

Safety Measures in place:

1. Each school in our district has a comprehensive emergency plan with safety response protocols that have been implemented with input from our local law enforcement agencies (Boardman police and Morrow County Sheriff Office) both organizations have building blueprints and access into our school buildings; They have every school's emergency plan handbook, they collaborate on our emergency procedures by sharing feedback on our protocols.
2. We have a monthly drill schedule that includes opportunities to practice fire drills, earthquake drills, lockout, lockdown, shelter-in-place, etc.)
3. For each drill conducted there is an evaluation process in which we track safety data such as student/staff accounted for and time to complete each drill.
4. Each year students and staff spend time reviewing procedures, getting training if necessary, and going over all procedures for each situation.
5. All of our schools updated and reviewed reunification plan protocols in conjunction with emergency responders (fire, police, sheriff).
6. We have implemented Bully and Harassment safe school tip lines via email, text, phone.
7. We have implemented Oregon State Patrol TIP line communication.
8. We are expending funds related to ensuring that every building has video surveillance. Another focus is that buildings have web based electronic access control where first responders and school officials have access to the cameras via the internet.
9. All schools currently have a single access point at the front door next to the main office and all schools require that visitors sign in at the main office to account for who is in our buildings.
10. We also require families to enter via main entry access doors, only approved custodial guardian can check out students from our schools and we will verify prior to releasing students.
11. All schools have security alarms when buildings are not occupied motion detectors, door alarms and glass breakage alarms protect public property and ensure that no hazardous materials can be placed in our schools.

Morrow County School District implemented its Standard Response Protocols based on recommendations from the i love u guys foundation ([www.iloveyouguys.org](http://www.iloveyouguys.org) ). These procedures were created to ensure the best possible preparation for emergencies and response to situations and to improve communication within schools and with emergency responders. Thousands of school districts and first responders (fire and safety organizations) throughout the country have implemented this program. Many school districts and first responder organizations have implemented this program to standardize actions, terminology and procedures.
