2. Amanda Necessary, Director of Student Services, had guest, Melissa Mitchell with
 - o Central Counties Services share about new state mandated Mental Health First Aid (MHFA). This bill requires school employees who regularly interact with students to take an evidence-based mental health training program, and MHFA meets this requirement.
 - o Temple ISD has already trained 200 staff members in MHFA since January 2025 with certifications lasting for 3 years.
Central Counties Services will be providing additional sessions in March and May of 2025. This allows staff members to recognize potential issues a student may be having and the steps to resolve or direct students.
3. Mabry Kullander, Temple ISD Nutritionist
 - o The week of March 3-7, 2025, National School Breakfast Week "Clue into Breakfast" focusing on the benefits of a nutritional meal to start your day.
 - o Concerns were raised about the breakfast options as they relate to the diabetic students. Ms. Kullander is currently working on those issues, but the actuality of the student selecting those appropriate options has been minimal. School Nutrition will continue to work on this matter while meeting the required guidelines.

The meeting was called to order at 11:50 am by Eric Haugeberg.

1. Welcome: Eric Haugeberg, Asst. Superintendent for Student Services
 - o Smart Device Policy Update: After presenting to the TISD School Board, it is determined that the current policy is unchanged, which will include same policy at the middle school level.
2. Kim Glawe, Director of Health Services
 - o Recent Vaccination Clinics – Advised that letters of reminder have been sent out to parents of 7th grade student of the state required vaccinations before the upcoming school year. Between all middle schools and preschool ages there were almost 400 student that needed vaccinations but working in conjunction with the Bell County Health Dept. by TISD Health Services Dept. hosting vaccination clinics at the campuses, that number is just under 200.
 - o Health Services End of Year Totals for the District of Nursing care: On a regular basis there is care of medically fragile students which include, tube feedings, catheterizations, and the care of student with post-transplant needs.

As of today, the TISD nurses have had 85,766 office visits, which do not include medication distribution (8,294 med visits), and over 1,500 parent calls. This along with hours of volunteer time within the school district and our community.

3. Eric Haugeberg, Asst. Superintendent for Student Services

- District Long-Range Plan

Gil Hollie, TISD Community Connections - shares about the continuing education classes being offered now at the campuses have seen an increase in attendance. Also, through a partnership with Christian ministry program about 1,000 food bags go home every Friday.

4. Mabry Kullander, TISD Nutritionist

- Summer Feeding Program available all summer long to all kids up to the age of 18 at no cost (over 18 - \$5.00 fee) No Sign-Up is required, or application needed. Breakfast and lunch will be served at multiple locations and dates. Information sheets are at each campus and TISD Administration building but can call for further details.

5. Windee Skrabanek, Head Athletic Trainer-Temple High School

- (ATS) Athletic Training Students presented an End of Year Wrap-Up. The program had 26 Athletic Trainer students for the 2024/2025 school year with included doing outreach and community service.
- ATS participating with the TISD SHAC shared their individual experiences (with Power Point) in being a part of the Athletic Training Program at Temple High School.
- A high point of this year is the new athletic facility providing much more functionality for all athletic students.
