Policy Implementation Summary & Recommendation

Overview of HB 1481 (2025 Legislative Session)

Effective no later than September 1, 2025, House Bill 1481 requires all Texas public schools to adopt and enforce a written policy prohibiting students from using personal communication devices on school property during the school day.

Key Provisions:

- Applies to any non-school-issued device capable of communication (smartphones, flip phones, smartwatches, tablets, radios, etc.)
- Allows schools to ban device possession altogether or designate secure storage
- Requires schools to honor exceptions for students with IEPs, 504 plans, medical documentation, or legal safety protocols
- Districts are no longer allowed to charge parents for cell phone retrievals
- Grants districts the authority to confiscate and dispose of devices after notice to parents

Campus Recommendation

Kaufman ISD will implement procedures that prohibit students from bringing personal

communication devices onto campus during the school day.

- Applies to any non-school-issued device capable of communication (smartphones, flip phones, smartwatches, tablets, radios, etc.)
- All personal communication devices will need to be turned off and stored in a secure location.
- A secure location will be defined as one of the following:
 - o Non-see-through backpack, vehicle, or a school-issued locker as applicable
 - o Note that students with IEPs or 504 plans will have access as defined by those plans. KISD will fully accommodate all required exemptions under the law.

Transition Period: August 14, 2025 – September 1, 2025

To ensure a smooth rollout of this policy, August 14 through September 1 will serve as a transition period:

- Students will be reminded to turn off devices and secure them. If it is seen or heard, it will be taken by a staff member.
- Phones found on students and not secured will be confiscated and held for parent pick-up.
- The focus will be on educating students and families, reinforcing expectations, and preparing for full enforcement.
- If a student has 3 or more offenses of this nature during the transition period, they may receive disciplinary consequences for not following campus directives.
