#### 8. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Legislative update – \$ on the formula, revised pupil weighting, do away with the GRAD test,

ADEDK will be fully funded in 2014-15.

Board discussed and has decided to make a commitment of \$1M over the next three years to help reduce class sizes. Goal is to reduce average class size from 24.2 to 22.5. Four FTEs will be added to the staffing allocation for 2013-14. The general fund balance is in a good position to allow this due to the district's conservative budgeting.

A meeting was held with administration regarding ADEDK programming/funding and to consider offering ADEDK for free this coming year due to the legislature fully funding ADEDK in 2014-15. ADEDK is still an option alongside the traditional half-day program. Funding implications were reviewed. Preliminary calculations show that it would cost approximately \$850,000 to implement ADEDK at no fee. Checked with neighboring districts as to what they are considering. STMA will wait until 2014-15. Monticello is still looking at this. Benefit of doing this is a hope to keep our students from open enrolling out of the district. All elementary principals were in favor and space is available.

Board felt this would be hard to do financially along with the current decision to add staff to improve class sizes. All board members fully support the idea of ADEDK programming, but the price tag is very high. The Board decided not to offer ADEDK for free for the 2013-14 school year. If any new information comes forward, the Board will review this at that time.

June 25 is the initial meeting of the Steering Committee meeting for the District Strategic Plan.
