Discipline Discipline	Additional supervision is provided in hallways near bathrooms. Only two students are allowed in bathrooms at a given time during instructional time.
	<u>Hallways</u>
	• Students are now required to carry paper passes when in hallways during instructional time.
	• At a recent meet and confer session with teachers, concerns were expressed about hallway behavior between 11:30-1:30. George Nemanich will work with high school admin and teachers on addressing this concern.
	• One class of older students have a different transition time than other 9 th -12 th graders; this often leads to disruptive behavior when 7 th -8 th graders are in class. A teacher will be assigned to escort that class to the next period and use a different route to the class.
	 General Concerns have been expressed about follow-up to educators who submit referrals. The district will review options for allowing teachers to access referrals and related consequences. The district will review the 500-series of policies to see if any
	 changes should be made to policies, procedures, or implementation. To reduce the number of teachers using personal leave on the same day, Superintendent Anderson will remind teachers of limits in the teacher agreement. The district will explore the possibility of providing de-escalation training for all teachers during workshop week.
	 The district will review MTSS processes to better meet the needs of students. Principal Nemanich will begin reviewing how educational structures should change to accommodate needs of students.
TBMS Principal	7 individuals have been invited to interview for the TBMS Principal position.
Teacher Placement	The district will be emailing an initial draft of teacher placements for the upcoming school year. The first draft only includes continuing contract teachers. After they have a chance to review the draft, updates will be made to include all teachers.
