Corporal Punishment/Use of Reasonable Physical Force**

Corporal Punishment

The use of corporal punishment in any form is strictly prohibited in the district. No student will be subject to the infliction of corporal punishment.

"Corporal punishment" is defined as the willful infliction of, or willfully causing the infliction of, physical pain.

No teacher, administrator, other school personnel or school volunteer will subject a student to corporal punishment or condone the use of corporal punishment by any person under his/her supervision or control. Permission to administer corporal punishment will not be sought or accepted from any parent or school official.

A staff member is authorized to employ <u>reasonable</u> physical force <u>upon a student</u> when <u>and to the</u> <u>extent</u>, in his/her professional judgment, the <u>application of</u> physical force is <u>necessary to prevent a</u> student from harming self, others or doing harm to district property <u>consistent with ORS 339.285-</u> <u>339.303</u>. Physical force shall not be used to discipline or punish a student. <u>A staff member found in</u> <u>violation of this policy may be subject to discipline up to and including dismissal. A volunteer found</u> <u>in violation of this policy by administration may be subject to sanctions and/or prohibited from</u> <u>volunteer service in the district.</u>

The superintendent shall inform all staff members and volunteers of this policy.

Use of Reasonable Physical Force

Reasonable physical force for the purposes of this policy is force which is sufficient to protect an individual's health and safety or to restrain an individual from carrying out an unauthorized or illegal action but should not reasonably be expected to cause life-threatening injury to the individual restrained or prevented from action.

Protecting the health and safety of its students is one of the primary responsibilities of a school.

Teachers and other individuals having charge of a class activity or event are held responsible for maintaining order and for protecting the health and safety of those present. In certain circumstances it may be necessary to use reasonable physical force to carry out the responsibility. Each building administrator shall provide training for school staff and volunteers in the acceptable use of physical force.

The building administrator shall establish a system for summoning aid from other staff, when necessary. Whenever possible, the principal or other identified staff shall assist the teacher needing to use physical force. In order to protect the health and safety of all concerned, all staff members shall provide assistance to other staff, if needed, in carrying out this policy.

Physical force should be the last method used to maintain order or protect the health or safety of students, staff or others present.
