Academics

- Our Curriculum Cycles continue to move along. We will have a few reads with our recommendations to the BOE at the second February meeting.
- We have been informed by the Department of Education that the new health standards will be released later this year. We will review these against our current plans and update as needed. This work started last year.
- We have sent our Art Teachers and our Social Studies Teachers to conferences to enhance their teaching pedagogy. These conference have helped us hone in on their professional practice as well as provided incite as to the direction of teaching in their respective fields.
