#### What Parents Need to Know about College

In order to ensure that as many of our students as possible continue on with their education — whether at a 4-year college, a community college or a trade school — parents need information. We do a pretty good job with our seniors preparing them for the transition but could do better with our younger students and families.

Paying for College — 80% of financial help is need-based, meaning it's based on how much you can afford to pay and how much your chosen college will cost. Most NVHS families will be eligible, depending on college choice. The other 20% is through scholarships, most of which are much like essay contests.

Community Colleges — Oregon community colleges will accept Oregon residents with a high school diploma. They do however do entrance testing and students with low math, reading or writing skills will pay for extra classes to improve skills. RCC has many terrific programs including the Oregon Transfer Degree that after 2 years, qualifies you to earn your Bachelors in 2 more years at a 4-year college.

Oregon Public Colleges — There are 7 of these including SOU in Ashland. Each has a minimum GPA requirement, requires the SAT or ACT tests be taken in high school and requires particular classes including math through Algebra II and 2 years of foreign language.

**Private Colleges** — There are several of these, many in the Portland area. Costs are higher but so are opportunities for financial assistance. Each has strong programs and students should choose based on desired major, college atmosphere and financial help available. They will also require the SAT or ACT and other requirements.

We encourage parents and students as early as the freshman year to visit colleges periodically, getting a flavor for each campus. Call the office to arrange for a schoolrelated absence.

Register online for the ACT at www.actstudent.org. The ACT test is \$47 with Writing.

#### Notice for Juniors and Parents of Juniors —

You will be filing your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Assistance) in January of 2011 for your freshman year of college. Be aware that any income you (the student) earn between January and December of 2010 will be regarded as money you have available to help pay for your college. Your parents' income is understood to come replete with expenses and obligations. Yours however is considered fair game and should be saved for college.

*If you will work during the 2010 calendar year*, you must report all of your earnings when you file your FAFSA in January 2011. FAFSAs are frequently audited; disclose all income. Put your earnings in a savings account so you will have them available to help with college expenses.

If you do not work during the 2010 calendar year, you will have no earnings to report and will be eligible for more financial aid. If you don't have to work, consider participating in sports or other activities, volunteering at the hospital or elsewhere or taking more challenging classes with (gasp) more homework.

I have yet to meet the high school student who actually saved all of his or her earnings but that is the assumption of the financial aid world.



#### **Update: Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (OAKS)**

We completed the first round of OAKS testing this trimester and are on our way to meeting our targets in at least two of the subject areas. We tested about 2/3 of our sophomore class, based on whether or not the student was currently enrolled in English, Math or Science. Students have two more opportunities to meet the standards.

#### So far:

Reading: 68% of those tested Met or Exceeded standards
Math: 41% of those tested Met or Exceeded standards
Science: 69% of those tested Met or Exceeded standards

Writing: testing has not yet occurred

As you can see, we're well on our way to our goals in Reading and Science but have a long way to go in Math. Teachers are working hard to help students get there, including reviewing old math concepts along with teaching the new ones.

Reading Target: 74% Meeting or Exceeding Standards

Math Target: 62% Meeting or Exceeding Standards

Science Target: 70% Meeting or Exceeding Standards

Writing Target: 66% Meeting or Exceeding Standards

Targets are based on the highest percentages reading standards in any Josephine County High School in the past 4 years. NVHS holds the Science record; HVHS holds the Writing record; GPHS holds the Math and Reading records. Good luck, Sophomores!



#### What happens if you fail a class in high school?

Freshmen are sometimes unaware that high school is different from middle school in how we treat F's. Any student who receives an F is now 1/2 credit behind in his/her quest for graduation. Students must earn 27 credits to graduate including several specific core classes. Failing a core class also means the student must retake the class, losing an elective s/he might have chosen.

Another consequence is that a student loses the right to take more advanced courses if s/he fails the prerequisite course (e.g. failing Intro to Art means you cannot take Art I).

If your student earned an F first trimester, you may require him/her to bring home a weekly progress report every Friday. These can be picked up before school in Student Services.

#### **New Graduation Requirements for the Class of 2013!**

In order to graduate in 2013, you will need to earn 27 credits including all of the required courses and electives of your choosing. You will also complete a Senior Project and must Meet or Exceed the state standards in Reading and Writing.
