CRES 2016-2017 Goals

- 100% of CRES students will demonstrate growth in Reading and Math as measured by the Spring, 2017 STAR Enterprise assessment
- CRES 3rd through 6th graders will score at or above the state average on the 2016
 Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments in math and reading
- CRES students will receive 25% fewer behavior reports for defiance and disrespect in 2016-17 than in 2015-16.
- CRES will increase parent involvement activities related to STEAM from zero in 2015-16 to 7 in 2016-17.
- The 1st grade STEAM Expo will take place on the evening of Thursday, May
 4th. We encourage all who can to attend.
- The Schools of Excellence celebration was a huge success. Many thanks to
 the businesses and individuals who donated funds to help us pay for t-shirts
 for all students and staff. It was awesome to see nearly 700 people dressed
 in maroon and white that day. Thank you to the board members who were

- The CRES students enjoyed the NED Show on April 19th. This is the second time we have had the NED Show visit us, but the first time since 2014. The message the students received was to Never give up, Encourage others, and Do your best, or N.E.D. Through the 45 minute assembly, students learned what it takes to be a champion in school and in life, and the message was tied in very well to our Paw Pride program. The show was free to CRES, as it works on a "Pay it Forward" model. The school the show visited last week agreed to sell NED yo-yos at the school, and the proceeds were used to pay for our show. In return, we agreed to sell the same yo-yos at CRES over a few days to help pay for the NED Show to visit its next school.
