Subject: FY26 Illinois School Maintenance Project Grant Discussion

As part of the FY2025-2026 State of Illinois Budget, approved this past spring, \$40M was appropriated to ISBE for the Illinois School Maintenance Project Grant Program (ISBE released details on October 16th). For these grants, the application window opened on Thursday, October 16th, and each school district has until Friday, January 30th to apply for the grant in IWAS. School Districts are eligible for up to \$50,000 of a matching grant for various school maintenance projects, including 1) emergency maintenance projects; 2) approved health, life, safety projects; 3) State priority projects; 4) permanent improvement projects, or 5) other approved maintenance projects. Board approval to participate in the program and identify the project(s) and local funding source(s) must be obtained prior to applying for the grant. Funds will be disbursed at the time of awarding, and the projects must be completed within 18 months of approval. All expenditure reporting, updating, monitoring and closing of the grants will occur in IWAS.

We received an identical \$50,000 grant in FY2017, 2018, 2020, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025. We are presenting this information for discussion in October and then we will ask for formal approval in November, so we can complete the application and file the grant request before the January 30th deadline. We will be recommending applying for \$50,000 to help pay for the Bathroom Renovations at Goodrich and Meadowview that will occur next summer (permanent improvement projects that fall under Category 4, as described above). We fully expect to receive approval of this grant application from ISBE and the matching District funds will come from the Capital Projects Fund.
