Comprehensive Needs Assessment – Demographics

Aledo ISD is a PPCD - 12th grade school district located in Parker and Tarrant Counties. There are nine campuses in the district consisting of four elementary campuses through grade 4; one intermediate campus, grades 5-6; one middle school, grades 7-8; one ninth grade campus, one high school, grades 10-12; and one alternative campus.

The district has four Title I campuses: Vandagriff Elementary, Coder Elementary, McCall Elementary, and McAnally Intermediate. Our total student enrollment for the 2012-2013 school year was 4,733. The enrollment for the 2013-2014 school year was 4,874. This shows a growth of 141 students.

The student population for the 2013-2014 school is ethnically represented as follows: African American – 1.4%; Hispanic – 11.1%; White – 83.9%; Native American – .5%; Asian – .7%; Two or more ethnicities – 2.4%.

For the 2013-2014 school year, 12.60% of the student population is Economically Disadvantaged, 2.56% is Limited English Proficient (LEP), 20.27% is At-Risk, 6.73% is Special Education, and 6.85% is Gifted and Talented. The district served 16 immigrant students during the school year, and we served 22 homeless students, a decrease of 6 homeless students from the previous year. The district also served 6 students in foster care and 2 unaccompanied youth.

The number of dropouts reported for 2012-2013 was 7 students.

During the 2013-2014 school year the district had a total staff of 499 consisting of teachers, professional support, campus administration, and central office administration compared to 479 in 2012-2013. The turnover rate for staff in 2013-2014 was 16.6% and in 2012-2013 it was 16.9%.
