

Validation Notes for the Report Card (RC) At-A-Glance Report - Version 2018.09.27

This is an updated preview of the school and district At-A-Glance Reports. There are 3 report types:

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) removed college going rates from the High School RC At-A-Glance Report due to concerns with the accuracy of the post-secondary enrollment data received from the National Student Clearinghouse. The ODE anticipates returning this data element to the High School RC At-A-Glance Report in 2018-19.

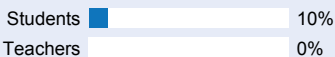

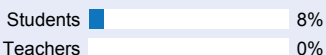

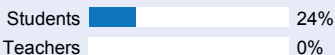

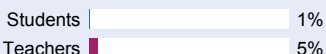

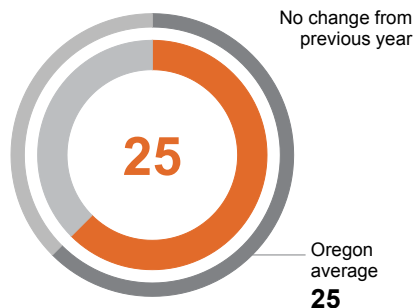

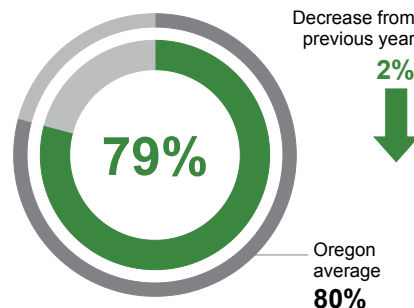

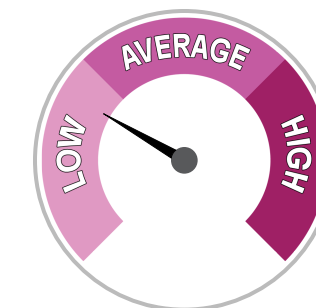

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

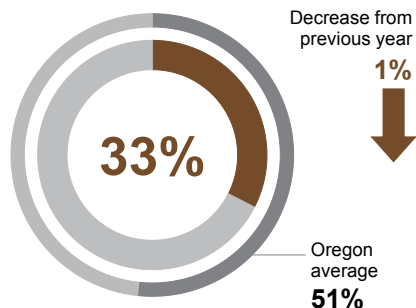
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

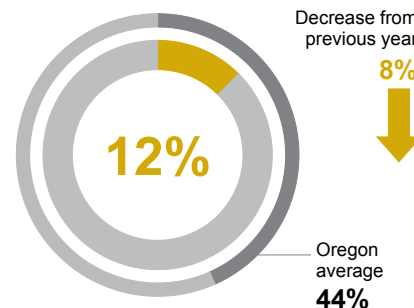
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



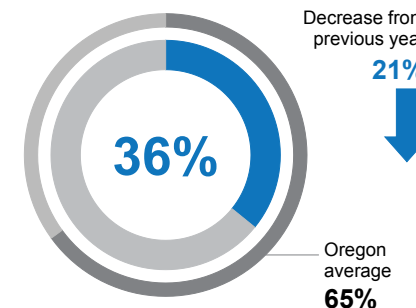
MATHEMATICS

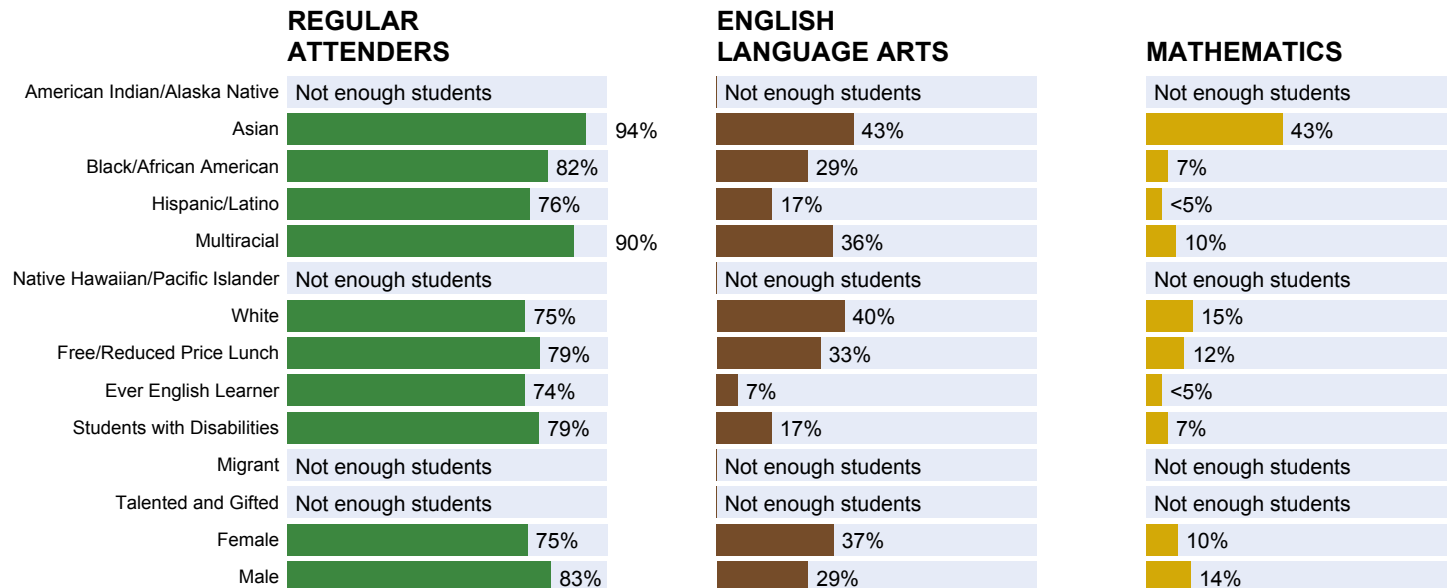
