The Why?

"Preparing self-directed learners to thrive in a changing global community"





The Why?

Factors*Sub Needs - this month average of 2.5 absences per day at the highschool*Sub Costs - @ \$135 per day. Savings of @ \$540 so far*Technology - iPads and Google Classroom*Student Behavior



The How?

Process - Before *Teacher volunteers on days where the plan supports sub-less *Absences known in advance *Teachers who are able to utilize the technology we have *10 minute classroom visit preview by administration *Teacher shares activities/lesson electronically



The How?

Process - During *Students report to the North Commons/Senior Lunch Room *Adult stays for up to 5 minutes *Students self manage restroom breaks and locker visits *Admin responsible for behaviors and student needs *Adults periodically check on the work space



The How Did It Go?

Adult Evaluation *Behavior (Administrative) - 1 report *Work production (Teacher) - same or better *Work quality (Teacher) - no clear difference *Anecdotally - today vs. sub-less days





The How Did It Go?

Student Input - Survey *Work Completion - 4.11/5 *Behavior - 4.12/5 *Do it Again? 189 Yes. 3 No. 98.4%

*Comments - I felt like I got more work done with a subless class then having an actual sub day. I think that it went very well and I got all my work done plus some for other classes. It gave us freedom to do our work but some people just don't listen. I really enjoyed it because we could actually talk to people and get help unlike when we have a sub usually there's only a select few that help. There was one moment where it was a little chaotic but it was MUCH calmer than it would be with a sub. Some students simply aren't ready or mature enough to be left without an instructor. It was very calming and a good work environment. I like it a lot better than an actual person watching us.



Now What?

*Data supporting using it going forward *Analyze some policies within sub-less - students leaving, student seating, 3rd block *Other grade levels *Classes it works for and doesn't
