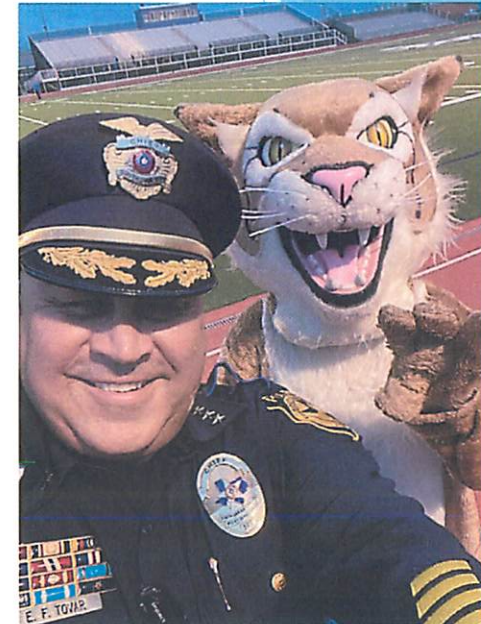

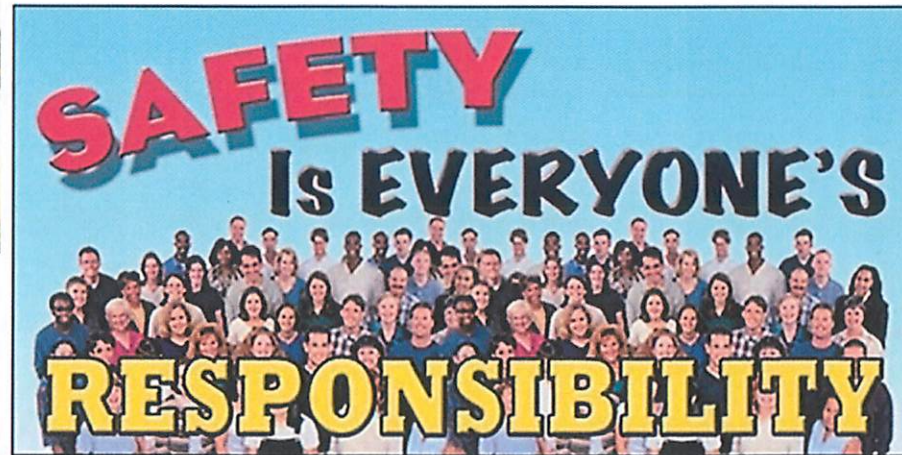
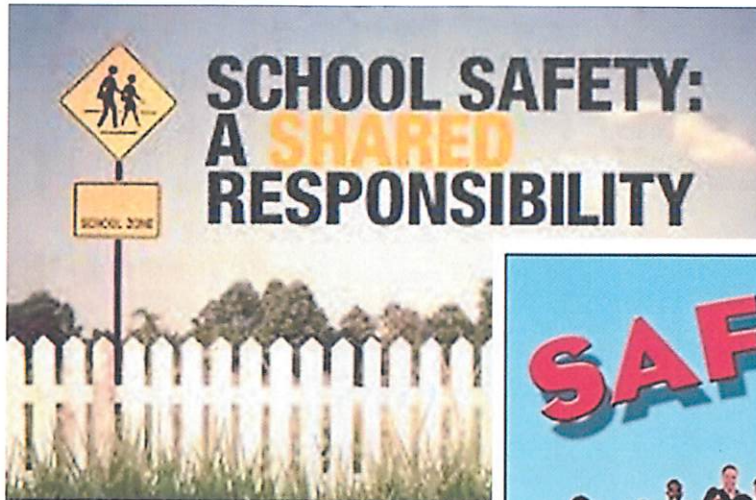




The Why?

# District Emergency Management



**Avoid Deny Defend**

**Three Minutes.**

- Only certified law enforcement are required to an active shooter as quickly as possible
- Response time averages about three minutes.
- Law enforcement should be focused on maximizing your personal safety and Law Enforcement is able to stop the threat.

**What You Do Matters.**

**Avoid** starts with your state of mind.

- Pay attention to your surroundings.
- Have an exit plan.
- Move away from the source of the threat as quickly as possible.
- The more distance and barriers between you and the threat, the better.

**Deny** when getting away is difficult or may be even impossible.

- Keep distance between you and the source.
- Create barriers to prevent or slow down a threat from getting to you.
- Turn the lights off.
- Remain out of sight and quiet by hiding behind large objects and silencing your phone.

**Defend** because you have the right to protect yourself.

- If you cannot Avoid or Deny, be prepared to defend yourself.
- Be aggressive and non-combat to your actions.
- The only legal tactic: TELL US ABOUT IT IMMEDIATELY.

**CALL 911** when you are in a safe area, inform the 911 operator that this is an active shooter situation.

**When Law Enforcement Arrives,**

**SHOW YOUR HANDS AND FOLLOW COMMANDS.**

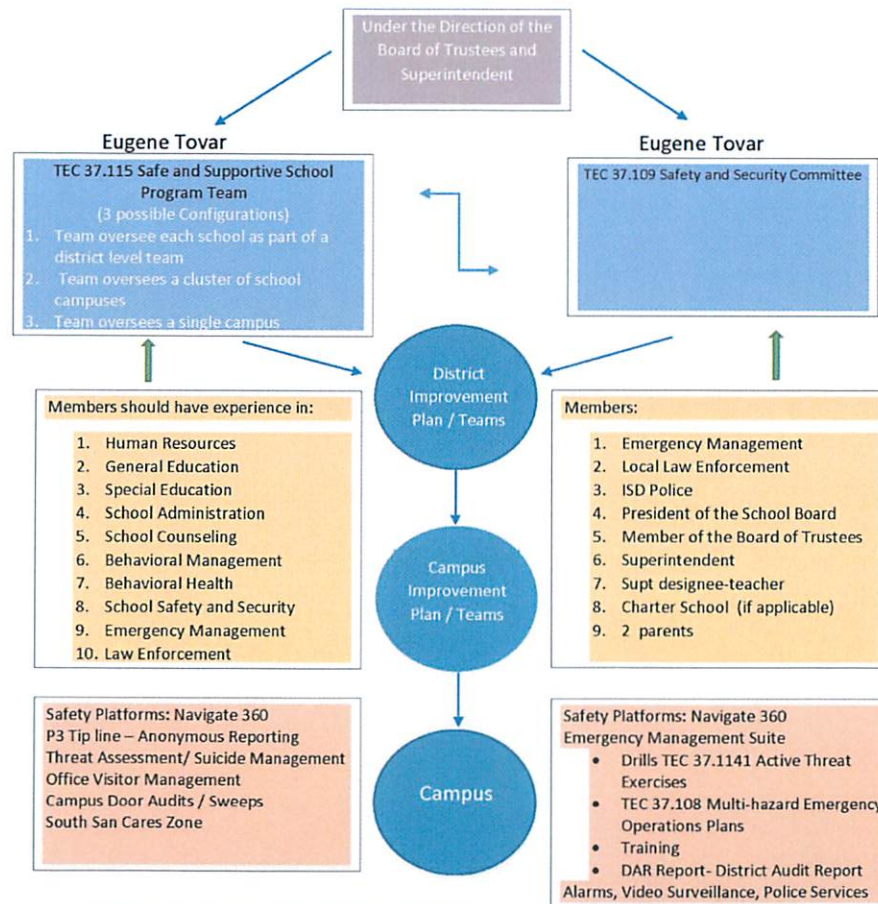

3,213 campus checks conducted

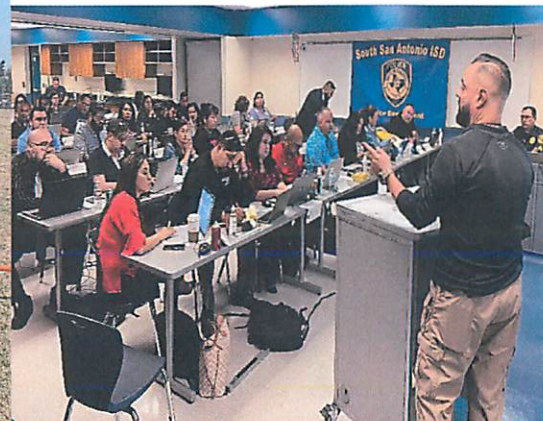
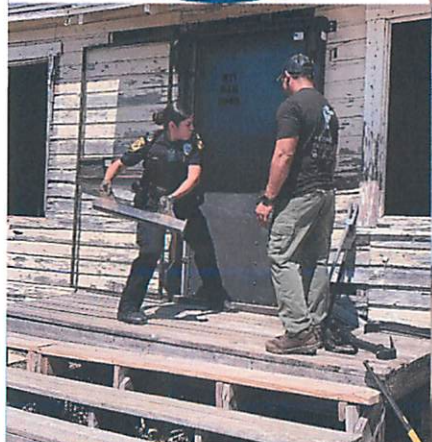
