Executive Summary	
Highlights: This report contains monitoring results for Operational Expectation 9 (OE-9), which focuses on communicating with the public. Results from the parent and community survey conducted in May 2018 indicated that a majority of respondents are satisfied with Shorewood School District communications and with individual school communications. Responses to survey questions consistently reflected general satisfaction, including the timeliness of communications, channels for input and feedback, and communications that build support for the District. Overall, District communication was the top-rated area of satisfaction in the "How Are We Doing?" section of the survey.	1
Analysis: While the survey reflected general satisfaction with District communications, responses from parent and families continue to reflect higher marks than responses from community members who do not currently have children in the District. Though it is natural that parents and families consistently receive more communications from the District, this still presents an opportunity to continue to improve our communications with non-parents. The data shows that we have made some small gains since last year's survey with respect to community satisfaction with District communications. On the 2017 survey, responding to whether they agreed with the statement "I am satisfied with the communication that comes from the District," 58% of community members with no children in the District indicated that they agreed or strongly agreed and 22% disagreed or strongly disagreed. On the 2018 survey, responding to the same question, 60% of community members with no children in the District indicated that they agreed or strongly agreed, and only 13% disagreed or strongly disagreed. We will continue to focus on how we can most effectively communicate with Shorewood residents who do not currently have children enrolled in District schools.

Superintendent Interpretation

The Board values an informed, involved community as a way to improve the system and check public perceptions of the system.

- Timely flow: Regular communications as needed through a variety of media throughout the year.
- Appropriate input: Thoughts, concerns, questions, and ideas from our parents, alumni, partners, and community members, with clear channels for input/feedback in place for our stakeholders.
- Strategic two-way communication: We engage the public by delivering information and receiving feedback from our parents, alumni, partners, and community members in an organized, cyclical process around the District's condition and direction to help build mutual understanding and relationships.
- Builds understanding and support: Our communication efforts help stakeholders stay closely informed about the district's direction and progress, and develop and maintain a positive perception of the District.

Evidence:

Survey: "I am satisfied with the communication that comes from the District"

A majority of all respondents (85%) agreed or strongly agreed that "I am satisfied with the communication that comes from the District," while 5% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 10% disagreed or strongly disagreed. These results trended upward from last year, when 80% agreed or strongly agreed, 15% disagreed or strongly disagreed, and 5% didn't know. At the school level, a majority of parents responding to the same statement as it applies to their school — "I am satisfied with the communication that comes from the school" —agreed or strongly agreed (ATW 88%; LB 79%; SIS 85%; SHS/NH 91%).

Survey: "The District is effective in providing timely communications via multiple channels"

A majority (87%) agreed or strongly agreed that "The District is effective in providing timely communications via multiple channels," while 6% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 7% disagreed or strongly disagreed.

Survey: "The District's website is effective in providing timely and meaningful information"

A majority (65%) agreed or strongly agreed that "The District's website is effective in providing timely and meaningful information," while 20% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 15% disagreed or strongly disagreed. These results trended upward from last year, when 61% agreed or strongly agreed, 18% disagreed or strongly disagreed, and 21% didn't know.

Survey: "Communicating school district news and happenings"

Under the "How Are We Doing?" section of the survey, 87.1% of survey respondents who expressed an opinion rated "Communicating school district news and happenings" as "Great" or "Good." This was once again the highest ranking for any area evaluated by parents in this section of the survey.

Evidence:

Survey: "The District's communications have positively impacted my overall support of the School District" A majority of all respondents (70%) agreed or strongly agreed that "The District's communications have positively impacted my overall support of the School District," while 16% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 14% disagreed or strongly disagreed. These results trended upward from last year, when 65% agreed or strongly agreed, 19% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 16% disagreed or strongly disagreed. At the school level, a majority of parents responding to the same statement as it applies to their school — "The school's communications have positively impacted my overall support of the School District" — agreed or strongly agreed (ATW 79%; LB 80%; SIS 76%; SHS/NH 80%).

Survey: "The District provides opportunities for input and feedback"

A majority of all respondents (67%) agreed or strongly agreed that "The District provides opportunities for input and feedback," while 17% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 16% disagreed or strongly disagreed. These results trended upward from last year, when 61% agreed or strongly agreed, 21% indicated "don't know/doesn't apply," and 18% disagreed or strongly disagreed. At the school level, a majority of parents responding to the same statement, as it applies to their school — "The school provides opportunities for input and feedback" — agreed or strongly agreed (ATW: 80%; LB: 77%; SIS: 60%; SHS/NH 75%).
