
Browning Middle School Board Report June 8, 2021

- The Sletten Construction Company was back on campus the second week of May, tearing out areas of concrete that had been rejected. They re-poured that concrete and finished other areas outside that still needed sidewalks.

We are still waiting on cupboards and sinks/countertops in BJA, and seating for the FACS and BJA areas (crescent tables and chairs) is due to arrive in June. We have also requested a new countertop and sink be installed in the nurse's station. Three additional rows of bleachers will be installed in the gymnasium, which will take place this summer. Defective sections of the floor in the building will also be replaced this summer, and the wax and seal on the flooring will be removed, as our custodians were informed that this was not necessary for this type of flooring.

- April and May were busy months for testing, and here is the BMS testing schedule that took place this spring:

BENCHMARK – Realizing that BMS was 100% remote schooling August 20 - March 21, all assessments needed to be planned prior to possible testing dates. Since WIDA and SBAC have to be an "in-person" assessment, the planning became complicated with the Blackfeet Reservation being in lockdown/shut down due to Covid-19 tribal ordinance 121. BMS celebrates 100% of administration and certified staff, and 93% classified staff were certified test administrators for SBAC, which had a positive impact on test completion results. Additionally, ELA teachers administered the ISIP remotely, Math teachers administered the aimswebPLUS remotely, and SpEd, Supplemental Math 180, Supplemental Read 180, and System 44 administered both remotely and in person. aimswebPLUS data reflected positive gains and growth from Fall to Spring in all grades 6<sup>th</sup>- 8<sup>th</sup>, but are still below the national level. Testing was allowed until May 27, 2021, and BMS tested students up until that deadline. Full detailed reports will be available for June SBE data reflection and planning for next school year.
