- · Business casual
- · Jeans, t-shirts, athletic wear and rubber, beach type flip-flops are NOT acceptable

STAR EVENTS PARTICIPANTS | SKILLED DEMONSTRATION PARTICIPANTS

Follow event specifications for dress, and wear appropriate clothing for the nature of the presentation

UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE AT FCCLA SESSIONS

- · Skin-tight or revealing clothing
- · Midriff-baring clothing
- Extremely short skirts (shorter than 2 inches above the knee)
- · Clothing with printing that is suggestive, obscene or promotes illegal substances
- · Athletic clothing
- Swimwear
- · Rubber, beach type flip-flops
- · Night wear (pajamas) should not be worn outside of your hotel room

A list of qualifications for the 2017-2018 region officer candidates will be posted to the website in January. Please review with your voting delegate the election procedure found in the region constitution and have your voting delegate bring a #2 lead pencil to the House of Delegates session. Each chapter may have one voting delegate in attendance. The voting delegate badge will be in the registration packet that must be picked up before the House of Delegates session.

Chapters may turn in contributions to the Region II Service Learning Project on Friday during general registration. See the FCCLA website for specific information about the Service Learning Project.

Hotel information is available on the Texas FCCLA website. **Curfew** is set in the hotel at 11:00 p.m. This means that members should be in their rooms by 11:00 p.m. with doors closed and voices should not be heard from the halls or through the walls.
