AFTER SCHOOL TUTORING AND HOMEWORK HELP

One of the things that our 21st Century grant funding allows us to do is run an after school tutoring / homework help program. We have budgeted this year to run it four nights a week: Monday—Thursday. After school tutoring will run from 3:40 until 5:40. The buses will leave the school at 5:45 PM.

Any student who is in an after-school activity may ride the activity bus. Students who are staying for after-school tutoring and who are riding the bus are expected to stay in the classroom the entire time. Students who are walking, being picked up, or driving themselves may leave when they are finished working. Students may not leave the campus and return later. Students are given a 15 minute break and a sack "dinner" about 4:30. There is no cost for this meal. No student will be allowed to ride the activity bus if they are not in an after school program or a sport.

Students are required to sign in and out. If you are assuming your child is coming to after-school, you may call the school the following day to check on attendance. Many students could benefit from this extra help, so encourage your students to attend if they need the help.

The computer lab is open every night between 3:30 and 4:30 for student use.

Students are not allowed to just hang out after school. As important as having time to visit with their friends can be, we do not have the resources to supervise these students. Students must be in a classroom ready to work by 3:40. Students staying are asked to read and sign an Expectations for Behaviors contract.

SYNERVOICE

After receiving an automated call concerning your student's absences from our new phone messaging system, Synervoice, please call the school in the morning to clear your student's absences. The number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students end up doing lunch detentions for uncleared absences.

We will sometimes use Synervoice to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using Synervoice, it is important that you say "hello" as this triggers the message. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.

- **File your FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid):** Each student and one parent must complete this application for a student to be eligible for federal and state college grants (free money!!). First apply for a PIN at <u>www.pin.ed.gov.</u> Both the student and one parent/guardian must have a PIN (your electronic signature) to apply for the FAFSA. As soon after January 1st as possible, complete the FAFSA at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov.</u>
- Apply for the Oregon Student Assistance Commission (OSAC) Scholarships: This online scholarship application contains the Ford and Gear Up scholarships and many others. Complete the application at <u>www.getcollegefunds.org.</u> Early bird due date 2/26/11. Final due date 3/1/11.
- **IV Scholarship Packet:** Go through the IVHS Scholarship Packet and decide which scholarships you want to apply for. You will need **two letters of recommendation** (at least one from non-school, non-family). Ask your employers, community members, or friends of the family. You will also need to turn in three staff recommendations and four typed scholarship statements. The scholarship application is available online at <u>www.threerivers.k12.or.us.</u>, go to IVHS web site, then Ms. Tucker's teacher page to download forms. Due date is
- www.threerivers.k12.or.us., go to IVHS web site, then Ms. Tucker's teacher page to download forms. Due date is now—every day that goes by without turning this in, students miss out on deadlines for scholarships. Turn in to Ms. Gamble in Room 9.
- Apply for RCC Foundation Scholarship: If you may be attending RCC you should submit their scholarship application. Three out of four students who submit an application receive a scholarship. Apply online at www.rccfoundation.org.
- **Take the SAT:** If you are applying to a four year college, you need to take the SAT. The test will be given again at IVHS on May 7th. See Ms. Thornhill in the Counseling Center to see if you qualify for a fee waiver. Register for the SAT at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>. Our school code is 380150
- **Apply to Schools:** Don't forget to get your application for admissions and scholarships in by school deadlines. If you qualify for free or reduced lunch, you may be eligible for a deferral of application fees to Oregon University System schools.

Seniors, we need to have the exact and complete names for your diplomas. Most people include their middle name(s). Please come to the office and get your exact and full name on the list.

In an attempt to use less paper, postage, toner and time, I will be emailing students balance due statements instead of mailing them. I can also email notices about upcoming events. Please remember that graduating seniors will not receive their diploma if they owe any fines, fees or materials. Check with Mrs. Hall to see if anything is owed.

School Delays and Closures

This year, the decision to close or delay the start of school will be communicated to <u>all parents, staff, subs, media</u>, etc, via phone calls and e-mail utilizing Synrevoice.

Once the decision to close or delay the start of school takes place, which is planned to occur no later than 5:30 AM, the District Office will initiate Synrevoice to start making the calls. Parents and staff will start getting phone calls at this time. It is early for the phone to ring, but at least it will mean students will not be headed to the bus. Synervoice has the capacity to call hundreds of phones simultaneously.

Any closure or delay will also be posted on the district's web page.

If you do not have a phone or internet access, closure information will also be on radio and television listed below.

If school is in session and must be called because of a power outage, snow accumulation after the start of school, or some other emergency, the school will initiate Synervoice and parents will be notified.

It is <u>CRITICAL</u> that parents keep the enrollment information, particularly phone numbers and email addresses current. If we do not have the right information, you will not get the calls or emails. Please make sure to update with the schools as these things change.

2010/2011 ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS Illinois Valley, Lorna Byrne, Evergreen

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJO, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules. Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run <u>the roads affected are listed below</u>. If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.

Dear Three Rivers School District Parent/Guardian:

The No *Child* Left Behind *Act of 2001 (NCLB)* requires all states to create their own high academic standards or what a child should know and be able to do for all grades in reading/language arts and mathematics. Each school and district must improve each year until all students meet these standards. This yearly improvement in school performance is called Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). The Oregon Department of Education established a minimum percentage of students who must meet or exceed academic proficiency standards on required statewide tests. Each year the target is raised. This year 70% of all students are expected to meet or exceed state targeted goals on reading/language arts and math. The goal is that all (100%) students will meet or exceed these academic proficiency requirements by the 2013-2014 school year. While NCLB is in the process of being revised, the current law is still in effect until Congress completes it reauthorization process.

NCLB also requires that the Oregon Department of Education annually review the performance of each district that receives funds under Title I of the NCLB Act. If a district's academic performance is lower than the state's required level, the district will be identified as not making AYP

We are very proud of the accomplishments of all our schools based on the Oregon School Report Card that is issued each September for the school year. Hidden Valley High School, North Valley High School, Fleming Middle School, Manzanita School, Applegate School and Williams School have all been ranked by the Oregon School Report Card as Outstanding and all other TRSD's schools were ranked Satisfactory. In addition to this tremendous accomplishment we are please to report that 11 of our 14 schools met the federal guidelines for AYP.

Despite this commendation, the Three Rivers School District has been identified as not making AYP and is classified as being in Title 1 District Improvement –Year 1. The reason for this is that for 2 years in a row the district's total percentage of students with disabilities in elementary, middle, and high school did not meet the AYP goal. Due to the rising AYP goals, the district has anticipated this development and has already revised its Continuous Improvement Plan and identified strategies to meet the identified need and the ever growing difficulty of the challenge of having 100% of students meet or exceed state benchmarks.

A district with this classification has the responsibility to:

- consult with parents and school staff when developing the District Improvement Plan to identify and address the specific reasons for low student achievement. This plan explains how the district will use Title I and other funds to improve Title I schools;
- reserve at least ten percent of their annual Title I allocation to provide professional development for teachers and administrators.

Here are some suggestions to help you work with your school and district to support improvements:

- Learn more about the new NCLB requirements. Become aware of strategies to improve student academic achievement. Additional information and resources are available from the Oregon Department of Education (<u>http://www.ode.state.or.us/</u> <u>search/page?id=576</u>) and the US Department of Education (<u>www.ed.gov</u>) websites.
- 2. Talk with district staff about our District Improvement Plan to help students meet state standards in reading and mathematics.
- 3. Support and reinforce your child's good study habits and review their homework and test results.
- 4. Visit your child's school and volunteer.

District staff members are working diligently to ensure that every child meets high academic standards in a safe and caring learning environment.

The district is very proud of the success all its schools had during 2009-2010 based on the Oregon School Report Card ratings. We feel that our schools do an excellent job meeting the needs of all students daily but support the importance of striving to improve student success for each and every child.
