**Teaching, Learning & Relevance**

- Advanced Placement course exams are taking place throughout May. Exams are now administered electronically, with some courses being hybrid. Students scoring at or above the benchmark will be able to submit exam scores to universities for college credits. Advanced Placement courses offered at THS are: Biology, Psychology, US History, Macroeconomics, Literature & Composition, PreCalculus, Calculus, Statistics, and Physics.
- Project Lead The Way (engineering courses) will be administering their end-of-course exams. Students scoring at or above benchmark will be able to submit exam scores to universities for college credits. Many universities offer local benefits such as waived application fees, scholarships, advanced standing, and priority admissions acceptance.
- Dual credit courses with Nicolet College and Northcentral Technical College will be coming to a close in May. Students will complete final assessments and course requirements before the end of the semester. Students will receive high school credit along with credit documented on a college transcript to be used throughout the Wisconsin University and Technical College systems and beyond.
- Tomahawk High School Build Motor participated in the Indian Motorcycle of Metro Milwaukee’s Dyno Day. The students got the opportunity to test out a motorcycle on a real Dyno and learn from others.
- The CWIMA hosted both Machine Tool and Welding technical skills competitions. Top high school Juniors and Seniors from Cnetral Wisconsin competed against one another for scholarships that can be used at local technical colleges in any technical field. Individual awards were Bradyn Ristau 2nd Place in Welding who will receive a \$1900 scholarship and 8th place in the Lathe Competition was Tyler Strassman. The Tomahawk High School Team took 3rd place overall.

### **The Whole Student**

- The Class of 2026 hosted Prom at THS on April 18th. The Grand March took place in the Auditorium with the public in attendance. This was followed by the dance in the THS Cafe. It was a great night with over 125 students attending. Thanks to the Junior Class Officers and advisers for their hard work in planning the event.
- As a part of Appreciation Week, celebrated May 4th - 8th, staff also wanted to show appreciation for students. FBLA facilitated the coordination of activities for the students. Some of these activities included 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament, bowling, culinary, Innovations Lab, card games, art enrichment, community bike ride, video game tournaments, and more.
- Over \$175,000 in scholarships will be awarded on May 20th during the Senior Scholarship Awards Ceremony. There have been generous contributions from the community, local businesses, and everyone involved in the process.

### **District Workforce**

- Staff who teach dual credit courses have begun preparing for next school year. Staff attended a day of training on April 24th at Nicolet College, where they work directly with college instructors to review course expectations and curriculum. Others are also working with NTC with similar processes and will attend training later in August. These processes are required to maintain staff credentials to teach dual credit courses.
