Re: Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) Consolidated District Plan

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) requires each school district to submit a Consolidated District Plan to coordinate all programs under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). This includes programs governed by IDEA, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Strengthening Career and Technical Education Act, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, the Head Start Act, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, and the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act, among others.

Districts must develop the plan by collaborating with various stakeholders, including teachers, principals, paraprofessionals, administrators, specialized instructional support personnel, and parents of students served under ESSA.

District 96 engaged stakeholders through multiple venues, including All District Leadership Team (ADLT) meetings, Riverside Education Council Leadership/Administrative meetings, Special Education Leadership Team (SPELT) meetings, Parent Leadership Team (PLT) meetings, Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee (BPAC) meetings, and family night events.

The Consolidated Plan outlines how District 96 will use Title I, Title II, Title IV, English Learners, and IDEA funds to:

- Support student achievement
- Address the needs of at-risk students
- Provide professional development for staff
- Promote the social-emotional well-being of students and support the whole child

Consultations with private schools and preschools were conducted in advance, as the plan also includes allocating federal funds for those educational settings.

ISBE requires the local Board of Education to approve the district's Consolidated Plan annually.
