Approval of Hazardous DISD School Bus Routes for 2017/18

SUMMARY:

This item requests approval of hazardous school bus routes servicing students within the two-mile, parent-responsibility zone as required by Denton ISD Board Policy CAN (Local) Transportation Management – Student Transportation.

PREVIOUS BOARD ACTION:

Board approved 2016/17 hazardous bus routes 5/16.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

CNA (Local) The Board shall annually adopt a resolution to identify hazardous conditions within two miles of a school campus. The resolution shall describe the specific hazardous areas in which students who would otherwise be ineligible for transportation reside, but for whom the District shall provide transportation because of the hazardous conditions in those areas. The District shall publish the locations of the routes with hazardous conditions.

PROCEDURAL AND REPORTING IMPLICATIONS:

The District will provide TEA with a DISD Board of Trustees Resolution identifying hazardous routes operated within the District.

ALTERNATIVES:

No alternative actions are proposed.

SUPERINTENDENT'S RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend approval of the proposed resolution identifying 2017-18 hazardous bus routes operated by DISD.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD REGARDING HAZARDOUS TRAFFIC CONDITIONS

WHEREAS, Education code 42.155(d) allows the Board of Trustees of Denton Independent School District to obtain supplemental state funding for transporting regular, otherwise ineligible students who live within two miles of their school but who would be subject to hazardous traffic conditions if they walked to school;

WHEREAS, the TEA handbook on School Transportation Allotments requires the Board to adopt language providing the definition of hazardous traffic conditions applicable to the District and identifying the specific hazardous areas for which such funding is requested;

WHEREAS, the Board acknowledges the Education Code 42.155(d) provisions stating that a hazardous condition exists where no walkway is provided and students must walk along or across a freeway or expressway, an underpass, an overpass or a bridge, an uncontrolled major traffic artery, an industrial or commercial area, or another comparable condition;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Denton Independent School District has determined that a hazardous condition exists because there is no walkway where students must walk along or cross:
