English 1:

We are currently focused on research. We are working through the following TEKS: 20-Research Plan. 21-Gathering sources. 22-Synthesizing Information. 23-Organizing and presenting ideas. Students are assigned project topics ranging from McCarthyism, Scopes Trial, Evolution of man, and Civil Disobedience...all topics related to our reading of *Inherit the Wind*. Each student will write an essay in MLA format complete with Works

Cited page. Students with similar topics will be grouped as "experts" and will lead a class discussion over each topic.

English 1 Pre-AP:

Students are reading Annie Dillard's collection of essays, *Teaching A Stone To Talk*. We are using this as our example of quality essay writing. We are also working through *Image Grammar*...using grammatical structures to teach quality writing. After working our way through these, students will write their own descriptive essay using Dillard's writings as models. Students will work through all phases of the writing process as presented in TEK 13.

Fifth Six Weeks: 2011

Work on a research paper about American authors and read a work written by the research subject- the report will be done in MLA style and utilize Internet, book, and periodical sources in the library and in the computer lab. The students will write a report over the written work and the author's life as well as present a power point presentation over their subject's life. They will also include a works cited page using MLA bibliographical citation.

Continue to focus on SAT Level vocabulary using the Marzano system of vocabulary. Continue to work on grammar, spelling, punctuation, and sentence structure using the DOL (daily oral language) system

Continue to write creatively through bell-work journal topics (alternated with DOL) Creative idiom project
