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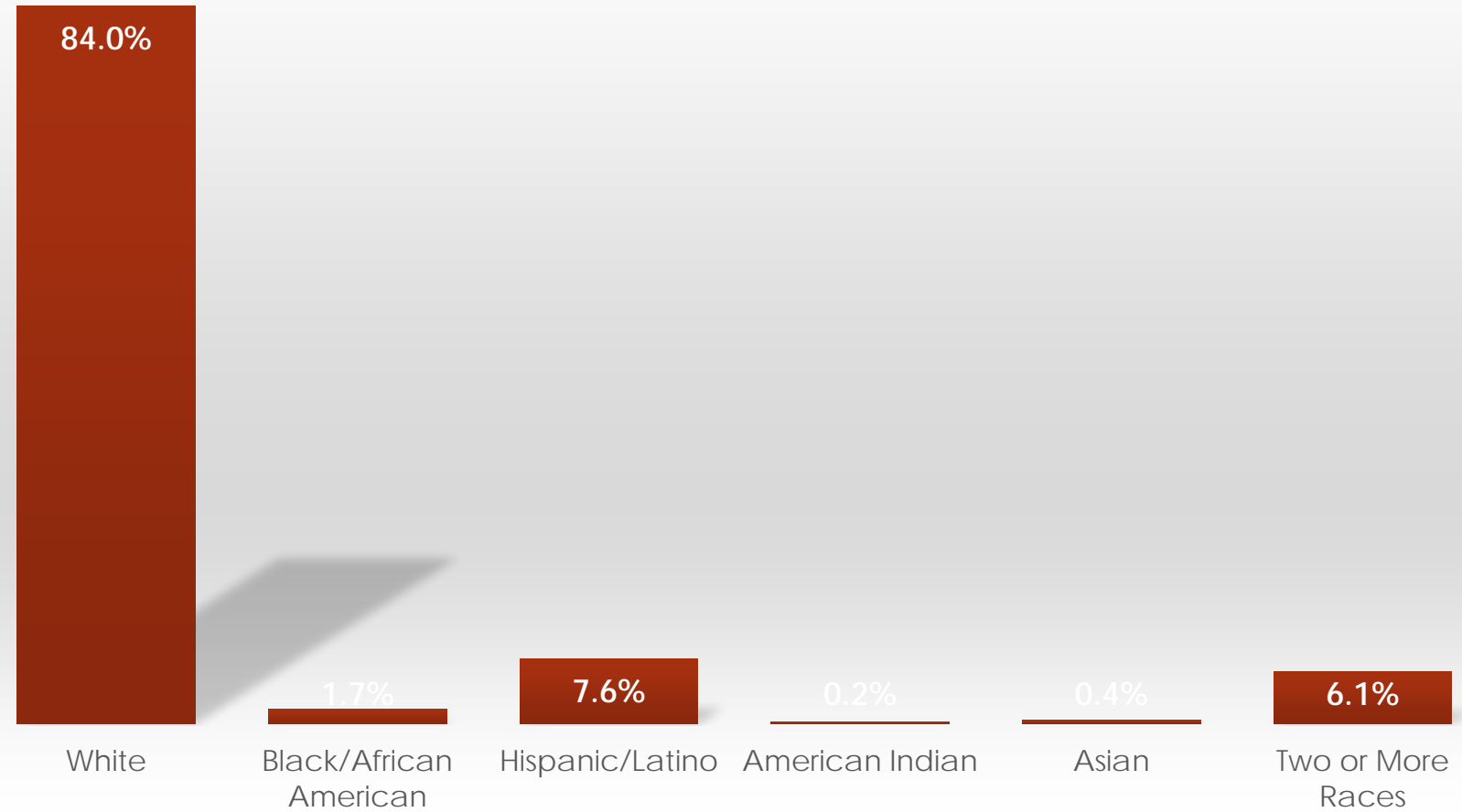



Fountain Lake Charter High School

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- ▶ Fountain Lake Charter High School has approximately 454 students in grades 9-12. The economics of the area revolve around tourism, retirement communities, the timber industry, health care, and retail. Because of the national forests and area lakes, the Corp of Engineers, Park Services, and timber companies play a vital role in the economy.

- ▶ Personalized Success Plan

- ▶ Build 6 year plan beginning freshman year. This includes their 4 year high school plan plus an additional 2 years after graduation.
- ▶ Transitioning this into Kuder Navigator, which is a comprehensive career readiness program to help students establish a career path.

 - Student pictures displayed when scoring 30+ on ACT

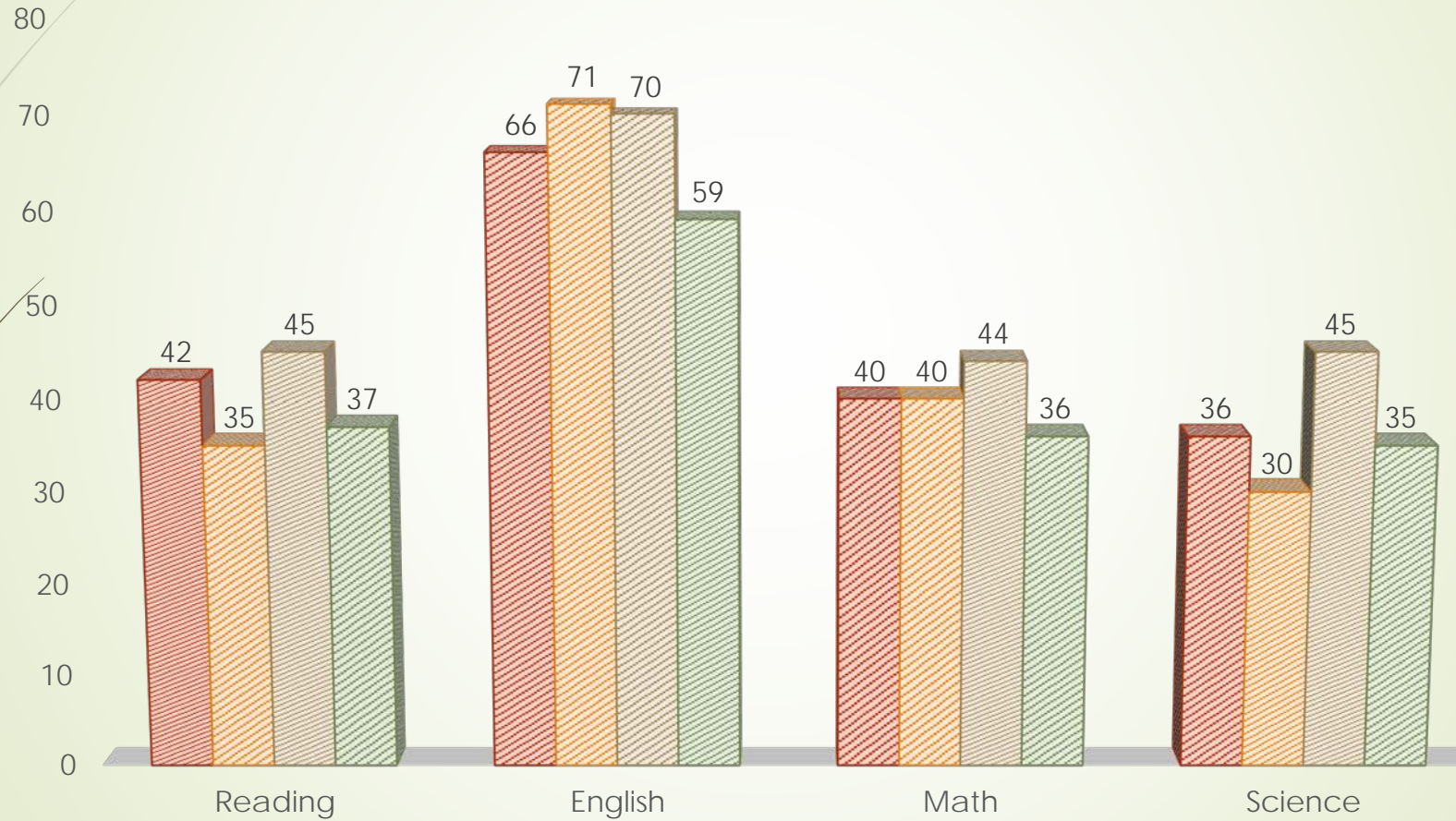


Changes in Leadership and Departments since Initial Charter

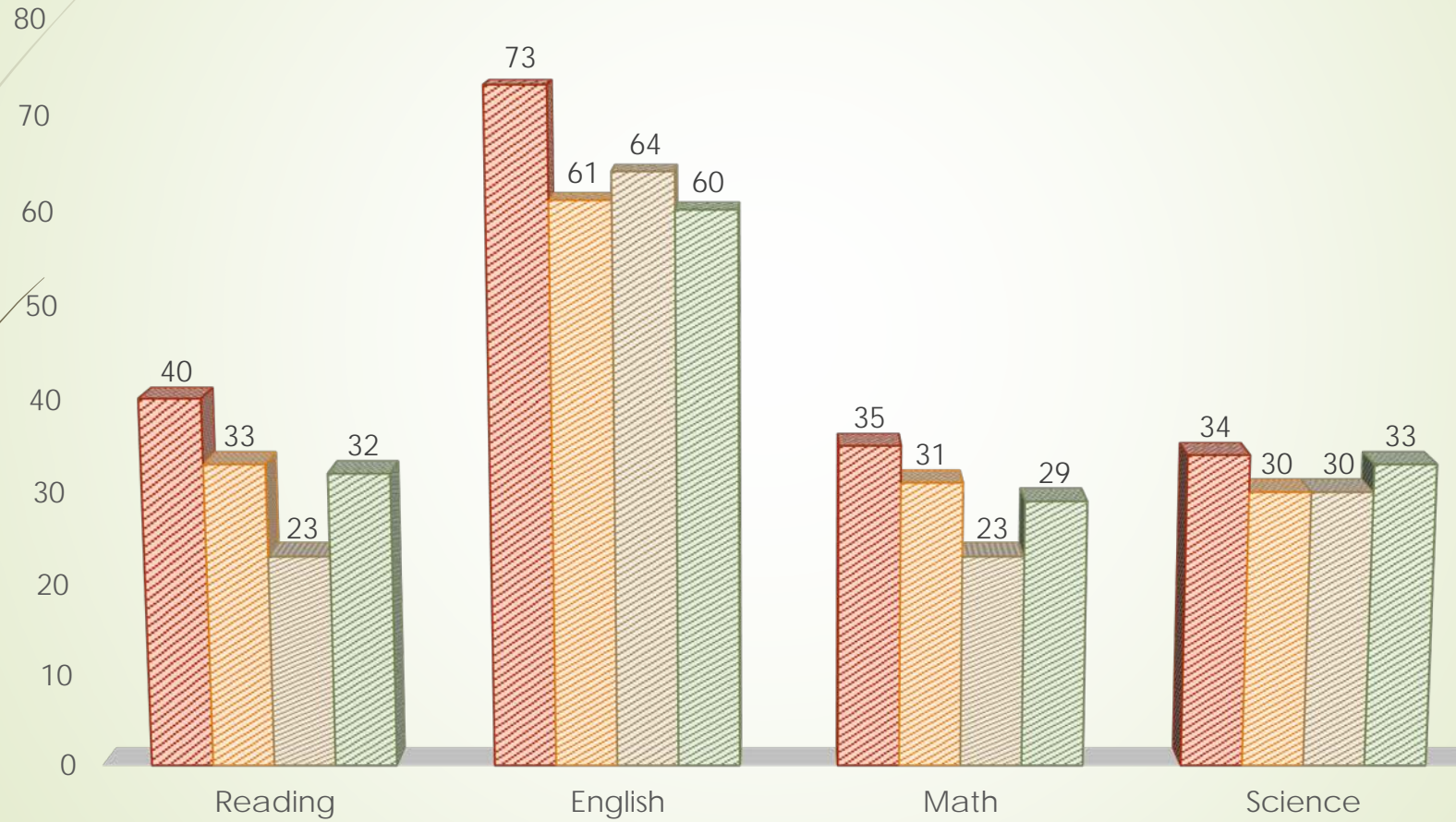
ACT ASPIRE DATA – GRADE 9

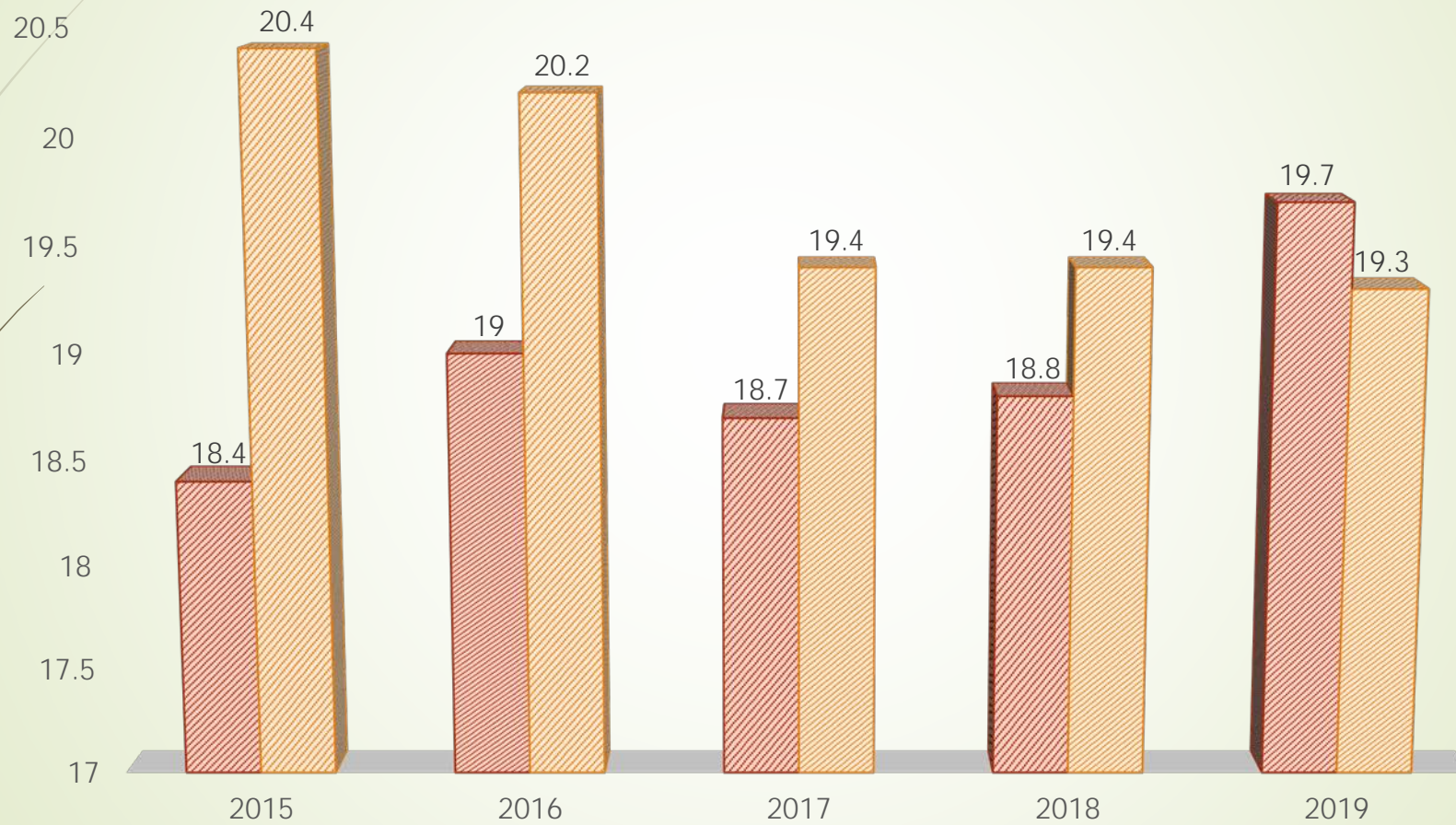
ACT ASPIRE DATA – GRADE 10
