This Board Report is requesting out of state travel the administrators and a teacher from LBMS to attend a Professional Learning Community (PLC) training on assessment in Tuscon Arizona. The workshop will be led by many nationally known experts in the PLC field, all specializing in Tier 1 & 2 interventions as part of the PLC process. The conference is held May 6&7th, 2023 and estimated cost of \$6,500 to attend this training will be paid for by Title 1 funds.
