BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Bee Math Science Partnership is a TARGET grant funded by TEA. 2003-2004 was the first year of this three-year grant. The grant involves the high school science and math teachers from Beeville ISD, Skidmore-Tynan ISD, and Pettus ISD. Together, these districts serve the entire high school student population of Bee County.

The TARGET grant was one of fifteen schools across Texas selected to participate in the Texas Capital Schoolhouse project at the State Capital on January 31 and February 1. The Texas Capitol Schoolhouse is a legislative event to give students and teachers from across the state of Texas the opportunity to showcase how technology is being used to improve public schools. The goal of the event is to provide information for legislators, other state leaders, and the general public about how the most advanced technologies and best practices are improving the way teachers teach and students learn!
