6.0 PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PURPOSE OF RECEIVING PUBLIC COMMENTS ON THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED 2022-2023 BUDGET AND 2022-2023 TAX RATE

Vanessa Riggs informed the Board that this was the public hearing for the adoption of the proposed 2022-2023 Budget and 2022-2023 Tax Rate. Budget workshops were held in April, May, June, and August of 2022. She published the notice in the Caller Times announcing the public hearing for the public. She reviewed the General Fund, Interest and Sinking, and the The factors that influenced the budget this school year Food Service Fund. were as follows: student enrollment/attendance, recruitment and retention of staff, COVID-19 Pandemic, increase in property values, federal funding available, and inflation. The school district's average daily attendance last school year was 2007, and they experienced 84.5% attendance. If they would have stayed there, they would have received less state aid and for this school year they should receive an increase in state aide. The certified values went up significantly by 9.42%. The school district went from an 88 to a 92-score rating on the FIRST rating and they will receive a Superior rating. The school district's current tax \$1.5636 and the administration is proposing a tax rate of \$1.5032. The M & O Tax Rate will be \$0.9832, and the I & S will be \$0.5200 for a total tax rate of \$1.5032. With the tax rate that they are proposing, homeowners will pay around \$110.13 less than

the previous year. She reviewed the following with the Board: \$2500 stipends, teacher salary schedules and compensation, substitute pay, TRS Care, TASB partnerships, general fund debt obligations (\$6,098,261.40), campus allocations, department budges (went down by 5%), and state compensatory. Currently, the school district has \$11.2 million in the Fund Balance and the school district only needs \$6.6 million. The school district has a healthy fund balance at this time. She reviewed different scenarios on what tax rate they would need to adopt in order to help out with the budget. In shifting some of the ESSER II and ESSER III funds, they ended up with a deficit of \$1,084,673, which was the budget she was proposing. The money would come out of the fund balance. Without the ESSER funds, they would have around a \$3 million deficit. The Board is required to adopt the budget by functions. The school district will experience \$26.9 million in revenues and \$28 million in expenditures. The administration recommends to eliminate positions through attrition, initiate a hiring freeze and only hire as needed, decrease the budgets or freeze the budgets, hold a tax ratification election, make sure that the expenditures match the academic mission and the board goals, and sale of properties. In the Debt Service, they have total outstanding principal of \$43,584,935, debt service requirements for FY 23 - \$4,126,426, recommend I & S tax rate increase to remain at 0.52 (with ADA of 2057), the estimated fund balance on August 31, 2022 is \$238,764. The Child Nutrition Department is looking very good with a total revenue of around \$2.6 million compared to last school year's deficit. Overall, the 2022-2023 budget was balanced. After the hearing, she asked the public if they had any questions.

8B SCHOOL BOARD CONTINUING EDUCATION RECORD – NOVEMBER 1, 2021 THROUGH NOVEMBER 1, 2022

Dr. Jose Moreno reminded the Board members that the school board members continuing education record runs from November of 2021 through November 1, 2022. Please contact Ms. Padilla on the status of your hours and required workshops.

8C ENROLLMENT UPDATE

Dr. Jose Moreno reported that the school district ended up with a total enrollment of 2459 this past school year. The projected enrollment based on the budget is 2420 and as of today, the enrollment was at 2461. The school district is at a better place now and the principals will start working on their no-shows.

8D ATHLETIC FACILITY REPORT

Cage Perry presented a draft plan on the use of the school district's athletic facilities to the Board. He reported that most school districts use similar forms. He reviewed the rental prices for each of the athletic fields and the athletic facility agreements for play-off games, and the transparent fee schedule with the Board. The present play-off agreement forms are on the school district's website. He was working on a google form, and he was open to any suggestions or ideas that they might have.

8E FOOD SERVICE UPDATE – ADULT MEAL PRICES

Vanessa Riggs reported that Chris Teager, Food Service Director, had resigned from the school district last month. She was happy to introduce the new Food Service Director Estric Joseph who comes from California. He worked for fifteen years at a university before coming to Robstown. Also, she informed the Board that the prices for adult meals have gone up to \$4.50 for lunch and \$3.00 for breakfast because according to TEA calculations they were not charging enough.

8F REPORT ON RISD'S 2022 STATE ACCOUNTABILITY FINAL RATINGS

Adriana Tagle reported that they would be reviewing the RISD's 2022 State Accountability Final Ratings with the Board. The parents can access the ratings on texas.schools.gov, and they will also be posted on the school district's website. They were extremely proud of all of students and teachers for being committed to learning and achieving adversity these past school years. The expectation is that every student should grow each year. Belinda Alaniz reported that they received the final ratings. The overall design of the accountability is student achievement, school progress, and closing the gaps. School Districts can receive an A, B, or C and if they receive below a C they are not rated. The school district was rated a C in Student Achievement, a B in School Progress, and a C on Closing the Gaps for a total district rating of a B. The school district was moving in the right direction. San Pedro Elementary was not rated, Lotspeich Elementary School was not rated, Robert Driscoll received a C. Seale Jr. High School received a C. Robstown Early College High School received a B, and Salazar Crossroads Academy received a C. They will be going into a new STAAR testing and they have already started looking into it to help the students prepare. The school district has an advantage because they tested on-line last school year and they are ahead of the game. The non-rated campuses will have to come up with an improvement plan, target improvement plans, and hold a public meeting. For this school year, the STAAR test will be different in the way that students are tested, but the curriculum will be the same.

8G UPDATE OF CALENDAR OF EVENTS

Dr. Jose Moreno presented an update of the calendar of events for the month of September. He wanted to keep them up to date on the events that are coming up for the month of September.

8H SAFETY AND SECURITY UPDATE

Dr. Jose Moreno introduced Filiberto Tagle as the new Director of Safety and Security. They have been busy working on the audit that needed to be submitted in September to TEA. They have also been doing daily door checks to make sure that the doors are not staying open. He was very excited that they have started Phase I of the security for the main doors at Robert Driscoll Elementary School. This week they will finish at San Pedro and Lotspeich Elementary Schools. In September, they will start at Hattie Martin and continue with the secondary schools, central office, and athletic department.
