Our middle school, elementary schools, and preschoolers all had "Mummy" Hot Dogs for lunch! At the high school, my team made 400 personal pizzas into mini Jack-O-Lanterns! I am so proud of the way my team across the board embraced the holiday and made it fun for all the students!

November marked a new set of promotions that came down from Chartwells and is meant to be run until February. It's called Chili Days, Warm Bellies, and it's all about comfort food recipes that are warm and cozy to get us through the cold days of late fall and early winter! We are featuring a recipe from this promotion once per month at the elementary level and once per week at the secondary level! This past Tuesday, 11/11, all of our schools featured Sloppy Joe TOTchos which included homemade sloppy joes served over crispy tater tots! Staffing:

They would also deliver meals to the Young Adult Program, as they are currently picking up their meals from South Meadows. We are looking at a couple of different ways to make this work and I appreciate their collaboration on this topic!

Financials:

- The Senior Center ran through October with a sales volume of about \$16,700.
- Participation remains steady at around 60% throughout the district for our breakfast and lunch programs!
