

**FORT SAM HOUSTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT
BOARD OF TRUSTEES' RESOLUTION REGARDING
HAZARDOUS TRAFFIC CONDITIONS ON
FORT SAM HOUSTON, A U.S. ARMY INSTALLATION**

WHEREAS: Education Code 42.155(d) allows the Board of Trustees of Fort Sam Houston Independent School District, (015-914), to obtain supplemental state funding for transporting regular, otherwise ineligible students who live within two miles of their school but who would be subject to hazardous traffic conditions if they walked to school;

WHEREAS: The Texas Education Agency Handbook on School Transportation Allotments requires the Board to adopt language providing the definition of hazardous traffic conditions applicable to the District and identifying the specific hazardous areas for which such funding is requested;

WHEREAS: The Board acknowledges the Education Code 42.155(d) provisions stating that a hazardous condition exists where no walkway is provided and students must walk along or cross a freeway or expressway, an underpass, an overpass or a bridge, an uncontrolled major traffic artery, and industrial or commercial area, or another comparable condition;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Fort Sam Houston Independent School District has defined hazardous traffic conditions in the same manner as stated in Education Code 42.155(d) and has identified the following specific hazardous areas in which such conditions exist.

1. The blocks bounded by the Watkins Terrace Neighborhood have no sidewalks to the Fort Sam Houston Elementary School. Heavy vehicular traffic including U.S. Army transports, trucks, etc. and regular funeral processions entering the Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery grounds are routinely encountered. Additionally, kindergarten through sixth graders would have to pass through two U.S. Army Installation Access Control Points (guarded gates) geared only for vehicular traffic.
2. The blocks bounded by Harris Heights Neighborhood have no sidewalks to Fort Sam Houston Elementary School or Robert G. Cole Middle or High School. Additionally, the roads are routinely used for U.S. Army troop movement and heavy vehicular traffic.
3. The blocks of Patch, Chaffee, and Marvin R. Wood have no sidewalks to Fort Sam Houston Elementary School or Robert G. Cole Middle or High School. Additionally, the roads are routinely used for U.S. Army troop movement and heavy vehicular traffic. 4. Fort Sam Houston Post Campgrounds have no sidewalks and vehicular traffic. Additionally, the roads are routinely used for U.S. Army trucks and heavy vehicular traffic.
